At the time of statehood, Congress granted parcels of land to Utah and created permanent endowments to support these institutions.

Trust land parcels were allocated by apportioning the state into townships, each six by six miles, and dividing each township into 36 square-mile sections. Utah was given sections 2, 16, 32, and 36 in each township for public schools, resulting in a checkerboard of land ownership.

SITLA manages Utah's 3.4 million acres of trust land generating revenue through oil, gas, and mineral leases, rent, and royalties; real estate development and sales; and surface estate sales, leases, and easements

2015 \$45 million was distributed to public schools. We get around \$40K each year. We get to decide where to spend it.
