9.13.1.1 *Required number of credit for graduation will be four less than the number a student is able to earn in grades 9-12 carrying a full load each term. In addition to the graduation requirements of the Tennessee State Board of Education, students graduating from Maryville High School must complete a fourth credit in science. Maryville High School will provide a course catalog for each graduating class containing detailed graduation requirements.*

The Director of Schools, or designee, is authorized to adjust graduation requirements for non-transfer students. The school administration is authorized and directed to implement a plan to adjust graduation requirements for students transferring from other systems. A written plan will be developed for each student for whom graduation requirements are adjusted and will include a description of the change and the type of diploma that will be earned. In all cases, the adjusted credit requirements shall meet or exceed minimum applicable state requirements. ~~Maryville High School students meeting the requirements of the State Board of Education shall receive one of the diplomas described in the Rules, Regulations, and Minimum Standards of the Tennessee State Board of Education.~~

9.13.1.2 High School Credit Prior to Ninth Grade

Students who have successfully completed high school courses for credit prior to ninth grade can receive credit(s) toward graduation. The course content must be based on the appropriate state curriculum standards. See Procedures 9.13.

9.13.1.3 Repeating Courses in Grades 9-12

With the principal's permission, students may repeat courses on a space-available basis under provisions set forth in this policy.

Courses previously failed may be repeated in summer school or during the regular school year.

Courses passed with a grade of "B" or better may not be repeated. A passing grade of "C" or lower may be repeated with principal approval.

~~Effective in the 2012-2013 school year and thereafter,~~ When a course is repeated, the higher of the two (2) grades shall be computed as part of the accumulated grade-point average.

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The minimum non-resident tuition rate shall be determined by dividing the previous year's city budget allocation by the number of resident students. Children of city employees shall be fixed at 50% of the non-resident tuition rate per year.

Payment and Refunds

~~Payment must be received before students may attend school. Arrangements can be made at the school to pay up front or twice per year. Tuition payments for students starting in the middle of the term are prorated by day until the end of the term and are payable on the first day of class. Payments should be made at the school office and checks made out to Maryville City Schools.~~

~~Refunds are available on a daily prorated basis for withdrawals occurring up to six weeks before the end of the term after which refunds are not issued for withdrawals. Non payment or failure to resolve payments made with insufficient funds may result in student expulsion.~~

Tuition payments are due by the second Friday of each term. Two payment options are available. Option 1 is to pay in full at the beginning of the school year. Option 2 is to pay one half of the tuition in term one and the other half in term two. Regardless of the payment option selected, a five percent discount will apply to payments received by the first Friday of each term.

The student's tuition status will be revoked if payment is not received by the due date.

Refunds are available on a daily prorated basis for withdrawals occurring up to six weeks before the end of the term - after which refunds are not issued for withdrawals.

Tuition payments for students starting in the middle of the term are prorated by day until the end of the term and are payable on the first day of class.
