Minutes for November 13, 2017

The Board of Education met in regular session at 5:30 p.m., November 13, 2017, at Maryville Junior High School. Board members present were: Nick Black, Candy Morgan, Bethany Pope, Bob Proffitt, and Christi Sayles. Chairman Pope called the meeting to order and asked for a moment of silence followed by James Wilson, Student Council President, leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

UPDATE FROM MARYVILLE JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL – Lisa McGinley, Principal
