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College Admissions Requirements

- English 4.0 credits
- Mathematics 3.0 - 4.0 credits (minimum through Algebra II, math also required during senior year for college admissions)
- Science 3.0 - 4.0 credits (students must complete two credits of a lab science, one must be an algebra-based science)
- Social Studies 3.0 - 4.0 credits (required in history or any of the social sciences)
- World Language 2.0 credits minimum (of the same language)

Personalized Pathway Requirements (PPR)

*PPR = Personalized Pathway Requirements: Courses that lead to a specific post-high school career outcome chosen by the student, based on the student's interest and High School and Beyond Plan. PPR could be an extra credit of Art, two credits of World Language, one credit of CTE, or credits in another subject area focused in the student's area of interest.
