Percent of Parkland Students Who Currently Qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch in 2015. This is a 5% Increase from 2014.




## **Building Vocabulary**



Research shows that the more words parents use when speaking to an 8-month-old infant, the greater the size of their child's vocabulary at age 3. The landmark Hart-Risley study on language development documented that children from low-income families hear as many as 30 million fewer words than their more affluent peers before the age of 4.

#### The Importance of Books



Research has also revealed the detrimental effect to children when they are deprived of these opportunities. Gaps in reading readiness can hamper literacy development throughout a child's school years and beyond, hindering career options when the child becomes an adult (NELP, 2009).

### A Critical Milestone

The primary grades (K-2) focus on building literacy skills. In grades 3-5 the focus shifts from Learning to Read, to Reading to Learn. Students who have not mastered reading by 3rd grade therefore struggle in all other academic areas (math, science, social studies, etc.)



The gap widens as students progress through the curriculum. Research shows that students who are not reading on grade level by the end of 3rd grade have a 75% higher likelihood of not graduating
