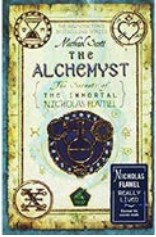

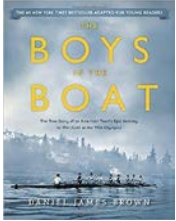

Discounted Summer Reading Books for Students entering 7th grade:



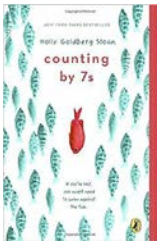
The Alchemist, by: Michael Scott (8.50 Paperback)

Twin 15-year-old siblings Sophie and Josh Newman take summer jobs across the street from one another: she at a coffee shop, he at a bookstore owned by Nick and Perry Fleming. Armed goons with “dead-looking skin and... marble eyes” (actually Golems) storm the bookshop, take Perry hostage and swipe a rare book. The stolen volume is the Codex, an ancient text of magical wisdom. Sophie and Josh learn that they are mentioned in the Codex’s prophecies: “The two that are one will come either to save or to destroy the world.”



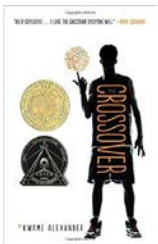
Boys in the Boat, by Daniel James Brown (8.50 Paperback)

This book tells the tale of the 1936 U.S. men’s Olympic eight-oar rowing team—nine working class boys who stormed the rowing world, transformed the sport, and galvanized the attention of millions of Americans. At the center of the tale is Joe Rantz, a teenager without family or prospects, whose personal quest captures the spirit of his crew and his generation. With rowers who were the sons of shipyard workers and farmers, the University of Washington’s eight-oar crew was never expected to defeat the elite East Coast teams, yet they did, going on to shock the world by challenging the German boat rowing for Adolf Hitler.



Counting by 7s, by Holly Goldberg Sloan (7.00 Paperback)

Willow Chance is a 12-year-old genius, obsessed with nature and diagnosing medical conditions, who finds it comforting to count by 7s. Willow's world is tragically changed when her parents both die in a car crash, leaving her alone in a baffling world. Willow manages to push through her grief to discover and unite a fascinatingly diverse and fully believable surrogate family.



The Crossover, by Kwame Alexander (13.00 Hardcover)

Twin brothers Josh and Jordan Bell are awesome on the court. But, Josh has more than basketball in his blood, he's got mad beats, too, that tell his family's story in verse, in this fast and furious novel of family. Josh and Jordan must come to grips with growing up on and off the court to realize breaking the rules comes at a terrible price, as their story's heart-stopping climax proves a game-changer for the entire family.



Island on Bird Street, by: Uri Orlev (6.00 Paperback)

When the entire Warsaw Ghetto is evacuated during World War II, one boy still remains hidden, waiting in obedience for his father to return as he told him he would. The young boy must struggle to survive in the midst of fear and danger.
