Review Minutes

Parent survey- only 80 responded – overwhelming response is donation instead of fundraising

Communication- Lower grades higher score, 4/5 grade a little lower

Theme of negative responses – none – lots of simple fixes

In Monday letter follow up with fixes

Donations- how/when to go about it

School supplies vs other donations

Last day of school – meet new teacher and class/suggested supply list

School improvement plan (SIP)

- Based off mid year dibels
 - What are goals for next year?
 - Reading Proficiency
 - Technology
 - Attendance
 - STEM
- Next year \$53,782 Trust land
- Data
 - No SAGE data yet
 - 17% increase on dibels from BOY to MOY
 - 10-15 kids in each grade just below benchmark
 - Americorp to try to support – 9 kids in program
 - Not effective/ program crashed
 - Teachers want program for kids who need more instruction to be pulled out by reading aides.
 - SPIRE program – 20 minute reading instruction, 4 days/week – requires program and personnel about it.
 - \$2500 for program, \$14,000 to run
 - Start with K-2

- Project Lead the Way - \$5000- district matches.
 - Modules – engineering tech
 - K-2 program
 - Encourage project based learning
- 4th grade- 30 laptops so they are 1-1 (from district)
 - 3 upper grades need replaced
 - 1st- needs 30, 2nd needs 60 carts, 3rd grade needs 60

 - \$6500 – SPIRE/aides
- STEM/Technology
 - \$32,000 on iPads
 - \$5000 to Project Lead the way
- Attendance
