Community Council Meeting November 30, 2017 5:00 PM

1. Welcome and Review

- a. Gary Sant called the meeting to order and asked that October's meeting minutes be reviewed
- b. Emily Clark reviewed the October meeting minutes
- c. The October meeting minutes were accepted

2. ILP Conference Discussion

- a. Most members felt the meetings (10 minutes) were too short and that it was difficult to stay on schedule which could result in parents leaving.
- b. Lisa Moller mentioned that it was difficult having fewer days for meeting and felt she had little prep-time, and

The plan is for Ms. Weber to return in January, but that is unlikely. In the meantime, a substitute counselor is available.

She also said there would be more discussion in individual classes. As far as helping the family is concerned, the school cannot sponsor any activity or fundraising to prevent the appearance of preferential treatment towards some students. Mrs. Isom spoke to the faculty and would like students to write notes about Laurel for the family to keep.
- c. Liz Roberts let council know the school is in desperate need of judges for the science fair. The science fair is on January 30th from 9:00-12:00, unless there are not enough judges then it may be a bit longer. Lunch will be provided. If you have a child in 6th grade, you cannot be a judge.
