**1. Welcome/Introductions**

Chair Kyle Roche opened the meeting at 6:15 p.m.

**2. Approval of April 20, 2016 Minutes**

Chair Roche presented the meeting minutes from April 20, 2016. A motion was made by Jason Hall to approve the minutes and was seconded by Julie Baer. The minutes were approved without objection.

**3. Follow up: Safe Neighborhood Access Program (SNAP) Bicycling to School Discussion**

Layton City recently conducted a traffic/safety study around Mountain View Elementary. Layton City determined that there was not a need for crosswalks at several major intersections and other areas. They advised students cross at other areas, such as 3250 North, instead.

With this information the MVCC again returned to the discussion of bicycling to school. The concern was raised of how is this policed if only a portion of the student body is able to safely ride bikes to school. Due to this concern and several other concerns, it was determined that at this point in time, the SNAP plan would not be amended to include bicycling to school. A

motion was made by Jason Hall to not amend the current SNAP plan and seconded by Stacey Carter. There were no objections. If in the future the issue is raised again, the Community Council will again address it and make a recommendation to the principal.

**4. Follow up: Morning Supervision of Playgrounds**

The changes recently made by the faculty to help address the issue of morning supervision of the playgrounds has improved the situation somewhat. It has been decided that these changes will continue next year. The teachers will wear the green vests for the first week of school and a reminder will be given the first week. A follow up reminder will be added to the agenda for the first meeting of the MVCC in the 2016-2017 school year.

**5. 2016-17 Election/Meeting Schedule**

There will be three parent-member Community Council openings next year. Community Council nominations will be announced at Back to School Night on August 18, 2016 with a brief explanation by Chair Roche. Nomination information and applications will be available at Back to School Night and nominations will be open from August 18 until 2:00 p.m. on September 2, 2016. Paper ballots will be prepared between September 6-9, 2016 and will go home on Monday, September 12, 2016. Elections will run September 13-16, 2016, with all ballots due to the front office by 2:00 pm on September 16, 2016. The first MVCC meeting will be September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 6:00 pm. The remaining meetings for the year will be scheduled at this meeting. Chair Roche made a motion to approve the election schedule, it was seconded by Jason Hall. There were no objections.

**6. Known Issues/Items for the Next Meeting**

Chair Roche thanked everyone for a wonderful year. Principal Robertson in particular was thanked for her many wonderful contributions to the school in the last year and a half and everyone wished her luck as she moves on to a new chapter in her life.
