Dear Families,

This year, students in 4^{th} and 5^{th} grades are embarking on a special project, a unique book club called *One School, One Book*. It is a program designed to engage and involve parents in the essential task of fostering the love of reading in children. This summer, students in 4^{th} and 5^{th} grades will be reading the novel, *Fish in a Tree*, by Lynda Mullaly-Hunt. The story focuses on Ally, a youngster who has always been good at drawing, but carries a big secret: She never quite learned how to read. This wonderful book captures the ups and downs of school, friendships, and the search for identify experienced by tweens and young teens everywhere. It also leaves its readers better than it found us – with greater empathy and a larger appreciation of ourselves and others.

The *One School, One Book* initiative is designed to create a shared learning experience between our school community and home. Every 4th and 5th grade family is asked to read the book over the course of the summer, with the goal of promoting a shared reading experience through families reading aloud with their children. Reading aloud to your child has tremendous educational benefits and can be a source of enjoyment for both students and parents. Read-alouds are not only enjoyable for beginning readers, but are just as essential for students in the upper elementary grades, as well. Reading comprehension improves as students listen to and discuss events, characters, and motivations. They learn to predict what will happen next as well as increase their vocabulary knowledge and build syntactic awareness. To facilitate this process, students will receive a **Discussion Guide** which features questions that can be used to talk about the book at home. However, our utmost goal is to encourages a lifelong enjoyment of reading, a gift your child will treasure forever.

In addition to reading the novel, 4th and 5th grade students are asked to create a **Summer Reading Project** that reflects what they have learned after reading the novel. Students will be able to share their projects at our *One Book, One School Celebration* on **Thursday, September 13th** during the school day. Ideas for projects, listed on the **Summer Reading Project Selections Sheet**, range from designing a game or a T-shirt, creating a diorama, a slide show or a video, to writing a new ending for the book, and the projects will be available for parents to see at Back to School Night that evening. Finally, students will participate in a whole Lower School activity to show what they learned by creating a display, which will be available for viewing during parent conferences in October.

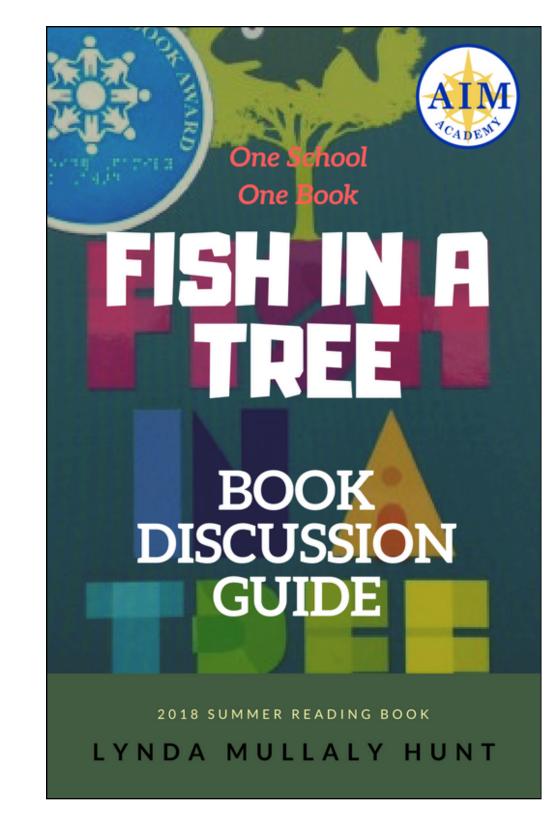
We thank you in advance for your support with this important endeavor and hope that you and your child have a wonderful time enjoying many great books together this summer.

Summer Reading Project Selections

*Select one activity for your assigned summer reading book.

- Write a new ending for your story. This new ending should be at least one page long.
- Write a continuation of your story. What happens in the new 'next' chapter? This should be at least one page in length.
- Write a song that tells about your story. You may sing your song with or without music. This song can be pop, country, rap-- the choice is yours! Be prepared to perform this for the class or have someone video your performance and bring the DVD for us to enjoy!
- Make a 3-minute video recording with a reenactment of one of your favorite events from the story. You may use friends and family members as actors and actresses. Please copy the video onto a DVD, or schedule a time for your parent to bring the camcorder and necessary cables for viewing.
- Write a comic book that tells about your favorite part of the book. The comic strip should have a minimum of six scenes or sections. Include comic style illustrations in either black and white or color. Include dialogue bubbles, too.
- Create a life-size portrait of one of the characters from your book. The
 portrait should include a written piece that tells about the character. The
 piece should also include information about events, or conflicts in the book
 that involve the character.
- o Make a shadow box or diorama displaying your favorite scene.
- Write a character diary, writing at least five journal entries as if you are the main character in the story. Write down events that happen during the story and reflect on how they affected the character and why.
- o Write a poem about one of the characters. Be sure it is at least 8 lines long.
- Create a timeline of the major events of your book. Use drawings or magazine cutouts to show the events along the timeline. Label each event.
- Design a t-shirt that promotes your book.
- Design a poster to advertise your book. Be creative! Include details, elaborate and use color! Try to make it 3-D or movable.
