Northshore School District administers Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) in English/Language Arts (ELA) and math in grades 3-8, SBA ELA in grade 10 and SBA Math in grade 11; Measurements of Student Progress (MSP) in Science for grades 5 and 8; End-of-Course (EOC) in math for grades 9 and 10; and EOC in Biology in grade 10 to students annually in compliance with state and federal laws.

School Improvement Plan

Every year teachers, counselors and administrators work together to improve how we teach and inspire students to learn at their highest levels, and to meet the affective needs of each individual.

Our teachers used release days to work together on effective instruction, in addition to identifying and responding to the affective needs of our students. The goal was to ensure we consistently gave students a supported social/emotional environment while also focusing on targeted learning opportunities. During release time teachers collaborated on instruction, analyzed formative assessment data, and engaged in collective inquiry to bring best practices in teaching and learning. For affective support they developed strategies to ensure that each student had a trusting adult that they felt connected to.

Our commitment to continuous improvement reaffirmed our common vision and collective commitments. We used these foundational pieces to guide our work in developing targeted learning support and acceleration for all students.

In addition, our Skyview counseling program provided opportunities for students in the areas of career education, academic planning, personal guidance and student recognition. Counselors delivered lessons in the classroom, conducted monthly class meetings and worked individually and in small groups with students. Meetings with parents, students and teachers were utilized to plan for academic improvement when needed.

Facility Information

Skyview opened in the fall of 1992 on 27 acres with 104,628 total square footage. Our facilities are used continuously for community activities. Adult recreation, youth sports, scouts, junior high PTAs, community groups and Northshore district employees are some of the many groups that utilize our facilities. Over the summer, more than one hundred volunteers came out on Community Serve Day to help spruce up our campus. Projects included painting hallways, classrooms and storage units. Volunteers also weeded and spread bark throughout the landscaping. We appreciate the support of such a caring community.

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with more than 20,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12.
