Northshore School District administers Smarter **Balanced Assessments** (SBA) in English/Language Arts (ELA) and math in grades 3-8, SBA ELA in grade 10 and SBA Math in grade 11; Measurements of Student Progress (MSP) in Science for grades 5 and 8; End-of-Course (EOC) in math for grades 9 and 10; and EOC in Biology in grade 10 to students annually in compliance with state and federal laws.

School Improvement Plan

Our 2016-17 School Improvement plan focused on connecting at risk students (those with attendance issues, not on track to graduate, ELL, or Special Education) and connect them to an adult in the building who would mentor and guide them in meeting graduation requirements. Our staff each connected with at least two students in their classes who needed this extra attention. Data from 2015-2016 compared to 2016-2017 showed that fewer students were not on track to graduate than the previous year due to this focus.

In addition to this important work, staff also spent time throughout the year receiving training and learning opportunities to prepare for the transition to becoming a four-year high school, teaching on the block, and the implementation of advisory in the 2017-2018 school year.





School Improvement Plan cont.

Staff, parents, and students also participated in a district wide effort to draft, revise, and complete a Strategic Planning Document that became the driver for how the 2017-2018 school year school improvement plans would be constructed. This will align our district and building goals and guide our work in improving student outcomes in the years ahead.

Facilities

Bothell High School was completely rebuilt over an eight-year period between 2000 and 2008. The 1950's facility was replaced with a state of the art 248,000 square foot facility that enhances student learning.

One of the unique features of the campus is a 600-seat theater that was enhanced by the participation of the Northshore Performing Arts Foundation. The Performing Arts Center is used regularly by school and community groups.





About Northshore:

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with more than 20,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12. The district encompasses over 60 square miles and includes the cities of Bothell, Kenmore and Woodinville as well as part of unincorporated King County.
