# Prep's Writing Style Guide MLA 7th Ed.

## **Basic Guidelines**

- > 12 point font
- Times New Roman font
- ➤ Double spaced lines (no extra spaces between paragraphs)
- > One inch margins all around
- Include Header in upper right corner of the page with your last name and page number (separated by a space)
- > Place your name, teacher's name, subject and section, and due date in the upper left hand corner (not in the header)
- > Center your title: keep in standardized 12 point Times New Roman font (do not bold or underline it)
- Indent five spaces or one-half inch at the beginning of each paragraph (one Tab space)

### Hamlet's Quest for Vengeance

#### Citing Sources Parenthetically

- A parenthetical reference contains the author's last name and page number of the borrowed material enclosed by parenthesis: (Graff 25).
- MLA recommends placing the parenthetical reference at the end of the sentence, but before the final period
- No encyclopedias may be used as primary sources
- If the original quote is longer than four typed lines, indent the left margin one inch (2 Tab spaces)

**Example:** In the nineteenth century, the supposed golden age of American education, "college faculties acted as disciplinary tribunals, periodically reviewing violations of rules" (Graff 25).

#### Formatting Works Cited Page

- > Center your Works Cited page title: keep in standardized 12 point Times New Roman font (do not bold or underline it)
- One inch margins all around
- List entries alphabetically by author's last name
- After the first line, all successive lines should be indented five spaces per entry

## **Book: Single Author**

Author's last name, first name. Book Title. Place of publication: Publisher, publication date. Medium of publication.

Lee, Harper. To Kill a Mockingbird. New York: Warner, 1982. Print.

#### **Online Database: Scholarly Journal**

Author's last name, first name. "Article Title." *Journal Title* Volume. Issue (Year of Publication): page numbers. *Name of Online Database*. Medium of Publication. Date of access. <URL>.
