In the beginning of the third academic quarter at Prep, Mr. Francini, Prep alumnus, rejoined our community as а Freshman/Sophomore guidance officer. Interested in his background, asked him а few questions...

Mr. Francini is a very interesting and personable member of our faculty. After speaking with him, I think that everyone, both the student body and the faculty, should try their best to get to know him...even if you aren't a New York Fan.


