125 SUMMER PROGRAMS

The Board feels strongly that the District should offer opportunities for student growth and enrichment through a robust program of summer offerings. The School District shall operate elementary summer programs for students in grades kindergarten through 5 and secondary summer programs for students in grades 6 through 12 to carry out the purposes set forth in this policy.

Summer programs are programs which are operated by the Lower Merion School District in June, July and/or August between the end of one school term and the beginning of another.

A. Elementary Summer School (Grades 1 through 5):

In order to provide support for students in reading, mathematics and other subjects to continue their school-based learning throughout the year, the District will provide an elementary summer program for students in grades kindergarten through 5. This is a bridge of learning that extends beyond the traditional school year and provides opportunities for growth and learning in connection with the District's strategic plan.

B. Secondary Summer School (Grades 6 through 12):

The District shall offer academic programs and courses in the summer for secondary levels for the following purposes:

- 1. To make-up certain core courses which the student failed during the regular school year;
- 2. To allow a student to audit certain core courses with the purpose of enriching the student's background in an academic discipline(s) in which the student has a special interest;
- 3. To complete certain advanced courses for which the students are qualified and for which they would receive academic credit.
- 4. To provide summer orientation programs for eighth grade students to support their transition to high school.
- 5. To provide opportunities for student growth and learning in connection with the District's strategic plan.

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The Superintendent or a designee shall plan and administer an elementary and secondary summer school each year within the provisions of this policy that will include:

- A. The schedule for summer school.
- B. Tuition and registration fees to be approved annually by the Board for both resident and non-resident students including opportunities for financial assistance.
- C. Standards for awarding credit for a course failed during the regular school year.
- D. Notice to parents/guardians and students of program offerings through, among other sources, the District website.
- E. Criteria for inclusion of courses in the summer program including, but not limited to, student class levels and individualized needs of students.
