

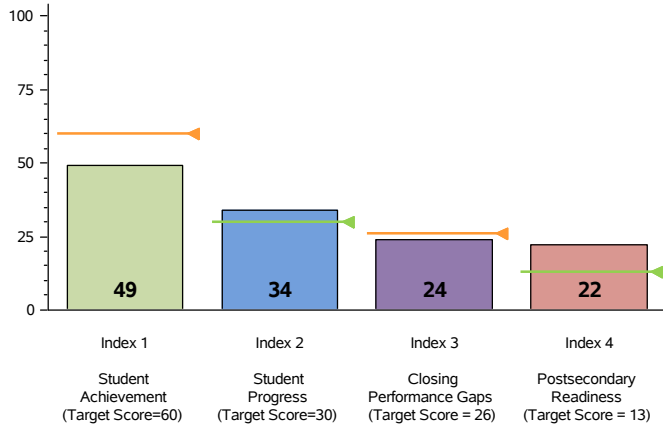

### 2016 Performance Index
