FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL **INFORMATION!!**

Students, you will LOOK for your NAME and Advisory Teacher/ Room on lists posted on the front window and in the hallways at Will James on August 24, 2017. At 8 am you will need to report directly to your advisory class to start the day. If you are compliant with immunizations, you will receive your schedule, locker number, padlock and planner right away in your Advisory classroom. Bring \$5 for a padlock and \$5 for a planner!



The following 4 resources are our main communication outlets. Please contact the main office to update PowerSchool and ICU contact information. If you are unable to access our website to view the news please contact our main office and a printed copy of the information will be made available. We will not be mailing out newsletters.



All students have a PowerSchool account where they can access the system to view grades, attendance, email teachers, and view school announcements on the daily bulletin.

Parents can create their own account and link multiple students. Parents can select the frequency of email alerts for students grades/attendance, assignment scores, school announcements, and lunch money balance. Contact the main office for instructions and/or access.



Stands for **Intensive Care Unit**. It is a communication tool that tracks <u>missing assignments</u> from students. Helps teachers and administrators communicate with students and parents quickly regarding missing assignments through email and/or text. Parent/guardian contact information from PowerSchool is entered in as ICU contact information. Please update information at the main office.

Attendance Procedures

Call 281-6158 or 281-6100 option 1

Parent verification of any absence is mandatory. Parents should call our <u>Attendance Office (281-6158)</u> each day the student is absent from school. If no contact is made, the parent or guardian must send a note with the student when they return to school. A note should be sent to school if you are taking a trip, skiing, vacationing, etc. The student will then be given his assignments so the work can be made up before the absence, if possible.

Make-up work and assignments will be collected for any student who has been absent three (3) or more days due to an accident or illness. Assignments must be requested before 9:30 a.m. and can be picked up after 2:30 p.m. If a student is to leave school for an appointment, a note or phone call should be presented to the attendance office **before** 8:10 a.m.

Students are not allowed to leave the school building unless they check out with the attendance office. No student will be released without parent authorization. If a student leaves without permission, the absence will be treated as unexcused. Student will NOT be released to anyone who is not on their PowerSchool contact list!

Will James Counselors are available to provide student and parent support. They are eager to schedule Parent /Teacher conferences and provide for individual student needs. Please call your child's counselor for intervention, course or schedule questions, support, or advice.

STUDENT DROP-OFF

ONLY BUSES and FACULTY will have access to the back area of the building from 7:15 am to 3:30 pm. You may use the **front** parking spaces that are provided during this time.

All students will need to report to the cafeteria or designated outdoor area in the back of the school if they arrive prior to 8:00. Available teachers will have a sign-in sheet near the cafeteria for any student who would like teacher access prior to 8:00. All parent drop offs will need to occur at the front of the building and students will walk around to the back cafeteria entrance.

The front doors open to students at 8:00 am each day. Between 8:00am and 8:05am all students who have arrived at school need to be heading to their 1st period class. We ask that students not arrive before 8:00 am unless, of course, they are involved in a school activity such as an early morning musical rehearsal, early athletics practice, breakfast, or BOOST. The school day ends at 3:10 p.m. and all students should have left campus by 3:30 p.m. unless they are involved in a school activity or are under the supervision of a classroom teacher. Parents, we ask that you visit with your student about reporting directly to school each day and not leaving the campus once they arrive! At no time do we want Will James students gathering off the school grounds in the alleys, nearby parks or businesses. We ask the cooperation of students and parents so that problems can be avoided.

Met Transit Busing \$21/month

Billings Met Transit has a Will James busing route (T3) and will drop off students outside Will James at 7:55 am and pick-up students at 3:25pm. **Routes T3 or Route 7** (Broadwater)

Immunization Requirements for School!

Students entering 7th grade must have a Tdap.

Please make it a priority to have the necessary immunizations given and submit the compliant documentation to the main office at Will James prior to August 24, 2017. Clinics do not notify the schools of updated records so it is your responsibility to make sure we have the proper documentation. IMPORTANT!! Unfortunately, if documentations for any student are not received by the first day of

school, your child will not be allowed to attend classes!!!!





The school nurse has multiple students and schools so there is not always a nurse on duty at Will James.

Some nursing services that are provided during the school year include vision and hearing screening on students new to the district, special education students, students who have failed previous screenings, requests from parents, staff or special services. Vision and scoliosis screening are done on all 7th grade students. The audiology department screens hearing on all 7th graders. If for any reason you do not want your child to participate in any of these screenings, please notify the nurse.

Also, please notify the nurse if your child has any medical condition or is on any medication of which we need to be aware. If your child has any allergies please notify the nurse and provide us with any necessary medication .

Prescription Medication Guidelines

For the safety of your child and others in school, the following steps need to be followed if your child requires any prescription medication during school hours.

1. A permission form must be filled out by the parent/guardian and **physician**. (Forms are available at the school main office)

2. Medications must be in a clearly labeled, original container with the following information:

- a. Name of Student
- b. Name of Medication
- c. Name of Physician
- d. Amount of medicine needed e. Time medicine is needed

3. Medication must be kept in the office where the student is responsible to come for it at the appropriate time.

4. The student must be able to dispense/pour the needed amount of medication under supervision. Please refer to the student handbook for guidelines covering over-the- counter medication such as cold tablets, acetaminophen, aspirin, and ibuprofen.

A/B Schedule

Students' health enhancement and non-music elective courses will be on a n A/B Schedule. This means that they alternate A classes with B classes every school day.

PLC (Professional Learning Communities) is a critical time where teachers focus on curriculum alignment, staff development, and how to prepare students for the knowledge that is needed. This replaces half-day PIR days. PLC days are on Wednesdays and students will be dismissed at 2:30pm.

Let's Get Organized

Once again this year we are asking that every student purchase a Will James day planner. All core classes will use them and the Advisory Teacher will be helping students organize their school day and keep track of assignments. Space is provided to record assignments each day for all subjects. The planner also provides the student with ideas on effective study skills, vocabulary builders, and other information of interest. The first pages of the planner contain the student handbook which outlines the rules, regulations, and other information about Will James and BPS. We ask that students bring \$5 on the first day of school to purchase their planner.

BOOST

(Homework assistance)

Any Will James student can choose to take advantage of our before and after school homework BOOST time. Students can receive help and support from a

teacher Monday through Thursday.



ICU

Intensive Care Unit (ICU) is a program used to assist with communication among parents, students, and teachers. If a student neglects to turn in an assignment, the teacher will enter that information into the ICU database and the parent will receive a text message and/or email alert about being placed on ICU. Our hope is that you will use this information to help assist and encourage your student to complete homework and assignments. Opportunities for assistance is during ICU lunch/Advisory, before or after school. Also, Boost is available.



<u> Tardy Policy</u>

Being prompt to class is important. Students will receive consequences for tardies. A student will be considered absent, not tardy, if they are over 5 minutes late for class. Fresh start each quarter.

- 1. Two tardies will be allowed without penalty.
- 2. Third tardy will result in one 30 minute detention.
- Fourth tardy will result in one 1 hour detention and Counselor intervention.
- 4. Fifth tardy will result in one day of In School Suspension and administrative intervention.
- 5. Sixth tardy and subsequent tardies will result in a day at Truancy Center (OSS) and administrative intervention.



TRUANCY POLICY:

Truancy is defined as: absence from school not verified as valid by the parent and the Assoc. Principal. Truancies include, but are not limited to: leaving the campus without permission, spending time in unauthorized places, and not being in assigned classes. Truancy will involve a conference with the Assoc. Principal and a blue unexcused admit to class. Parents will be advised of the truancy and the school district attendance officer will be notified. Students will be assigned to either In School Suspension (ISS) or sent to the Truancy Center at the Lincoln Center.

Student pictures for the 2017-2018 school year will be taken on Sept. 29h. Pictures will be taken during the students SS classes. Flyers will be sent home with students.

Retakes are scheduled after the week 10/23. We will announce on website and PowerSchool.

FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH FORMS

This application must be filled out annually!

Online application is on mealtime online or can be picked up in the main office.. Income-based, foster child, Categorical Certification, etc.

Free and reduced lunch applications are sent home with students the first day of school. The applications will need to be filled out and returned to the main office. It may take up to 10 days to process.

Sport Activities

A new physical examination will be required each year for middle school students.
