Communicable Disease Fact Sheet

Methicillin-Resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA)

What is MRSA?

• A staph infection of the skin that is resistant to some penicillin type antibiotics

Symptoms:

- A person with a skin infection caused by the staph bacteria may look like a pimple or boil and can be red, swollen, painful, or have pus or other drainage
- These skin infections commonly occur at sites of visible skin trauma such as cuts and abrasions, and areas of the body covered by hair
- More serious infections such as pneumonia, bloodstream infections or surgical would infections are very rare in healthy people who get MRSA skin infections

How is it spread:

• MRSA is usually transmitted by direct skin-to-skin contact or contact with shared items or surfaces that have come into direct contact with someone else's infection (e.g., towels, used bandages)

Treatment:

- Most staph infections and MRSA infections are treatable with antibiotics
- Almost all MRSA infections may be treated by draining the abscess or boil with or without antibiotics
- Drainage of skin boils or abscesses should only be done by a healthcare provider

Prevention:

- Wash hands often or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Keep your cuts and scrapes clean and cover them with bandages
- Do not touch other people's cuts and bandages
- Do not share personal items like towels or razors

Exclusion from school:

- Unless directed by a physician, students with MRSA infections should not be excluded from school (www.cdc.gov)
- Exclusion from school and sports activities should be reserved for those with wound drainage ("pus") that cannot be covered and contained with a clean, dry bandage and for those who cannot maintain good personal hygiene. (www.cdc.gov)
