**NONINSTRUCTIONAL OPERATIONS**

**8100**

Transportation

The Board’s primary concern in providing transportation services to students is the safety and protection of the health of students.

The District shall provide transportation to and from school for a student who:

1. resides at least one and one-half (1 1/2) miles from the nearest appropriate school (determined by the nearest and best route from the junction of the driveway of the student’s home<sup>1</sup> and the nearest public road to the nearest door of the school the student attends or to a bus stop, whichever the case may be); or
2. is a student with a disability, whose IEP identifies transportation as a related service; or
3. in the judgment of the Board of Trustees, has another compelling and legally sufficient reason to receive transportation services, including the age or health or safety of the student.

The type of transportation provided by the District may be by a school bus or other vehicle, or by such individual transportation as paying the parent or guardian for individually transporting the student. Homeless students shall be transported in accordance with the McKinney Homeless Assistance Act and state law.
