



Students should have the following items with them when they arrive for school on the first day

Fourth Grade

- **Homeroom (4Y and 4R):** In order to help facilitate the development of effective organizational skills with the incoming fourth graders, the fourth grade homeroom classes will supply the necessary school supplies for each student.
- **Spanish Students:** One Spanish/English dictionary to use at home (recommended: a dictionary designed for students in paperback, such as Webster's English/Spanish dictionary); Subject dividers (For Spanish classroom binder. Binder will be provided.) with pockets labeled (5 - Tarea, Exámenes, Pruebas, Apuntes, Proyectos)
- **Mandarin Students:** Pocket Oxford Chinese Dictionary (English/Chinese, Chinese/English); Bar Charts Quick Study Chart – Chinese Vocabulary, and Chinese Grammar Chart (Amazon, Barnes and Noble, etc.), one spiral notebook (you can continue using the one from G3 Mandarin) ; one package binder paper

Fifth Grade

- **Homeroom (5Z & 5P):** In order to continue the development of effective organizational skills, the fifth grade homeroom teachers will supply necessary school supplies, including binders, for each student. We appreciate and celebrate each child's desire to be unique, and there will be opportunities for students to customize the supplies provided by teachers.
- **Home Study Area (5Z & 5P):** Homework assignments will be made with the understanding that a student's home study area contains:
 - 1 pair of student scissors
 - 1 extra-fine point, black Sharpie (ultra-fine also works.)
 - 1 fine point, black Sharpie
 - 1 Glue Stick, 0.26 oz. (jumbo size)
 - Colored pencils
 - Markers
 - Crayons
 - Pencils, erasers
 - Printer paper & binder paper
- **Spanish Students:**
 - one set of 5 tab dividers
 - one 9³/₄x7¹/₂" 100 sheet bound composition book (you can continue to use last year's if it is in good condition)
 - one white 1" three-ring binder
 - three pencils
 - one package binder paper
 - one small pencil pouch
 - 100 pack of lined flashcards

Sixth Grade

- **Homeroom (Kirk and Evans)**
 - Subject dividers, unlabeled (15 dividers)
 - Pen/pencil holder – zip up style with holes for binder rings
 - One sturdy three-ring binder with 2" rings and zipper
 - Four highlighters (2 yellow)
 - 100 pack flashcards
 - 1 pair of scissors
 - 1 package of binder paper – year's supply (College-ruled)
 - Box of #2 pencils
 - Six pens
 - Ruler with centimeters
 - Scientific calculator (eg. Casio Scientific Solar calculator FX260 or TI30XA @ Target, Staples or Office Depot)
 - 100 page composition notebook (for science notes)
- **Spanish Students:**
 - one 9¾x7½" 100 sheet bound composition book; (you can continue to use last year's if it is in good condition)
 - one set of 5 tab dividers; three pencils and eraser tips;
 - two highlighters;
 - one red marking pen;
 - one package binder paper;
 - one small pencil pouch;
 - 100 pack of lined flashcards;
 - one Spanish/English dictionary to use at home (recommended: a dictionary designed for students in paperback, such as Webster's English/Spanish dictionary);
 - Bar Charts, Inc. Quick Study Chart – “Spanish Vocabulary” (Barnes and Noble, etc.)
 - Optional: students may use a separate binder for Spanish or their homeroom binder

- **P.E.** shoe requirements below:

PE Shoes For All Middle Division Students

All shoes for P.E. should have the following:

1. Significant padding under the heel area of the shoe.
2. They should flex easily under the ball of the foot (and nowhere else).
3. They should have a firm heel cup to hold the foot in position.
4. They should be padded inside for comfort, and vented for evaporation.
5. The laces should be firmly secured so that the support structures of the shoe can do their job.
