

## Academic Graduation Requirements

**Students must complete 27 academic credits during grades 9-12**

Required Curriculum	Credits Required	Classes Satisfying Requirements
<b>English</b>	<b>4.0</b>	One English class per year (9 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> ); 12 <sup>th</sup> grade may include AP, Concurrent Enrollment or AP Foreign Language (see your counselor for options)
<b>Social Studies</b>	<b>3.0</b>	9 <sup>th</sup> – World Geography; 10 <sup>th</sup> – World Civilization or AP European History; 11 <sup>th</sup> – U.S. Studies or AP U. S. History; 12 <sup>th</sup> – U.S. Government and Civics
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>3.0</b>	Minimum of 3 consecutive courses
<b>Science</b>	<b>3.0</b>	One class from two of the four foundation areas (Life Science, Chemistry, Earth Science or Physics), plus an additional class from foundation areas or applied/advanced areas. (Consult your counselor for options)
<b>Technology</b>	<b>1.0</b>	Business, Family/Consumer Science, Applied Technology, Internships; includes DATC classes
<b>Fine Arts</b>	<b>1.5</b>	Art, Music, Dance, Theater, Interior Design, Clothing Design, Speech, Photography (check with counselor to ensure eligibility)
<b>Phys. Education Elec.</b>	<b>.5</b>	Lifetime Activities, Dance, Conditioning, Yoga, PE Skills and Techniques
<b>Fitness for Life</b>	<b>.5</b>	Fitness for Life (no substitutions)
<b>Health</b>	<b>.5</b>	Consumer Health or Introduction to Health Sciences
<b>Computer Technology</b>	<b>.5</b>	Computer Technology or advanced computer class
<b>Financial Literacy</b>	<b>.5</b>	Financial Literacy (no substitutions)
<b>Electives</b>	<b>8.5</b>	Additional classes from areas where requirements have been filled

**Notes:** (1) Only classes that have been passed (D- or better) count for credit. If you have received an F in any class, see your counselor for credit make-up options. (2) Classes may be taken for credit from Utah Students Connect, BYU High School Correspondence, Northridge Learning Center and other sources. Be sure to check with your counselor before enrolling in any class outside of your school to ensure credits are acceptable to meet graduation requirements and do not impact the number of classes you may take in school.
