Visual Art Level 3

Create: Students will refine original work through persistence, reflection and evaluation.

- 1. Choose from a range of materials and methods of traditional and contemporary artistic practices, following or breaking established conventions to plan the making of multiple works of art and design based on a theme, idea or concept.
- 2. Experiment, plan, and make multiple works of art that explore a personally meaningful theme, idea, or concept.
- 3. Demonstrate in works of art or design how visual and material culture defines, shapes, enhances, inhibits, and/or empowers people's lives.
- 4. Reflect, revise, and refine works of art or design considering relevant traditional and contemporary criteria, as well as personal artistic vision.

Present: Students will convey meaning in the way the art is presented.

- 1. Critique, justify and present choices in the process of analyzing, selecting, curating, and presenting artwork for a specific exhibit or event.
- 2. Curate a collection of objects, artifacts, or artwork to affect the viewer's understanding of social, cultural, and/or political experiences

Respond: Students will articulate how works of art convey meaning for the observer as well as the creator.

- 1. Analyze how responses to art develop over time based on knowledge of and experience with art and life.
- 2. Determine the commonalities with a group of artists or visual images attributed to a particular type of art, timeframe, or culture
- 3. Construct evaluations of a work of art or collection of works based on differing sets of criteria.

Connect: Student will relate artistic works with personal meaning and research the impact cultural practices.

- 1. Synthesize knowledge of social, cultural, historical, and personal life with art-making approaches to create meaningful works of art or design.
- 2. Appraise the impact of an artist or a group of artists on the beliefs, values, and behaviors of a society.
