- ★ College costs are too high; college debt
- ★ Too many students are not attending college or completing college
- ★ States need to grow their workforce with the right credentials
- ★ Students waste time (and \$) on college courses that don't count

ALL students can access college credit while in high school!

#### Earn College Credit While In High School Which program is best for your student?

Colleges may vary in what score is accepted for credit.
•	Opportunity to take paid summer course(s), if necessary. Course & grade listed on GL transcript for all college courses.	•	Optional summer courses at the expense of the student/family. Credit only on GL transcript for summer classes. Course & grade for academic school year listed on GL transcript.	•	Summer course work may be assigned by teacher Course is weighted 0.35 honor points/0.5 credit.

While all programs are available to all Gull Lake students, there are factors to consider when deciding which program(s) best fits your student. Consider high school academic performance, post-secondary plans, and the amount of personal/social and academic support your student					
•	Plans to begin at a local college, earn transfer credits for a university, or earn career credential.	•	Plans to attend 4-year university immediately after high school. Typically, a GPA of 2.8 or higher.	•	Plans to attend a competitive 4-year university after high school. Typically, a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

# What is Early College?

- Open to all 10th grade high school students
- A <u>5-year</u> high school program that combines both high school requirements and college credit opportunities
- Ideally, students begin taking college courses in grade 11; gradually increasing until full-time college student in grade 13

# Goals of Gull Lake Early College

- 1. Increase the amount of Gull Lake graduates who <u>complete</u> a college degree
- 2. Increase college success for Gull Lake students through college knowledge and support systems
- 3. Assist with the financial burden of college costs to families
- 4. Expand high school opportunities based on students' individual needs and interests

# Early College Completion

By the end of grade 13, Early College students will be considered a "completer" of Early College if one of the following is met:

- □ Associate Degree (62 credits)
- 60+ Transferable Credits
- Occupational Certificate (AVG. 30 credits)
- □ MEMCA Certificate (15+ credits & career experience)

### What Students Want to Know

- ★ Students may participate in graduation activities with their original graduating class (June 2023)
- ★ High school diploma is held until completion of grade
   13; graduation year listed on the diploma (2023)
- ★ Students are not eligible to play school-sponsored sports in the grade 13
- ★ Students will not be required to physically attend GLCS during grade 13---They are full time college students

# What does Grade 13 look like?

- Complete/continue requirements for college program
- Take a math-related course in the final year (grade 13)
- Take Gull Lake's online course, Early College Capstone; have weekly contact with EC Mentor
- Meet with college counselor on <u>college</u> campus for scheduling and regular advising
- Complete MEMCA requirements, if needed

# What happens after Grade 13?

Depending on college program of study, student may:

- > enter workforce
- ➤ continue at community college
- > apply for entry to 4-year university

### Applicants to 4-year university:

Apply to university as a first-year <u>freshman</u> with advanced standing. This will allow students to be considered for freshman scholarships. ×

### What Parents Want to Know

- "What expenses can I expect?"
  - program of study (or lab-time classes) like science,
     computer, art, etc. may require additional tuition cost
  - college partner choice (WMU or out-of-county community college) will impact the amount of money students pay out of pocket
  - **parking** costs; gas money
  - textbooks and class supplies are <u>paid upfront</u> by the student/family
    - after the semester, the business office will calculate a refund up to the amount allotted by the state

### Keep in mind...

- □ **Transportation** is responsibility of student/parent
- Students follow both the high school and college academic calendar (spring break, holidays, etc may differ)
- FERPA limits what you can find out about your child's progress at college- information not readily available
- Federal financial aid (FAFSA) is not available until AFTER Grade 13 and high school diploma is completed
- Students must **refund** the district for courses failed/withdrawn from

## Factors to Consider

- Student needs to accept support
- **GL issued chromebooks** are not always compatible with college coursework
- No guarantees that participating will result in earning an associate's degree
- Poor grades in college may negatively impact both high school and college transcript and future financial aid
- Social maturity of student--personal/social and academic
- Students will encounter adult students in their college courses
- Some **content** in college classes may be adult in nature

## **Steps for Enrollment**

- Submit <u>GLEC Application</u> no later than August 27, 2021 or before JUNIOR year begins
  - Priority Deadline March 5, 2021
- Student continues the college going process with guidance from Jodee Stanton and GL counselor
  - application to WMU, KCC, or KVCC
  - placement test at the college
  - Meet with college counselor
  - Course Registration & paperwork
  - College orientation
