Lodi High's ASL CLUB meets weekly and is taught by student Pam Decko in room 107.

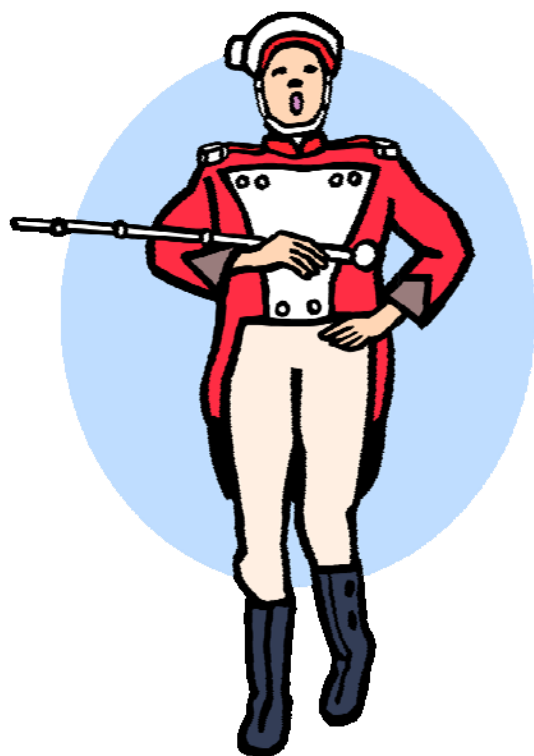

Drill Team

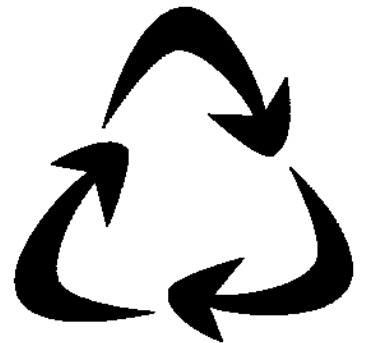

Friday Nite Live



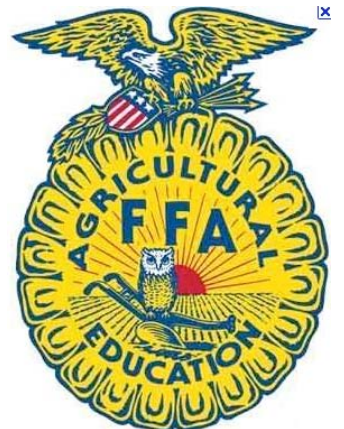
