I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to inform the school community and the general public of the position of the School Board on visitors to school buildings and other school property.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The School Board encourages interest on the part of parents, and community members, full-time PSEO students, visiting students who are enrolled in other districts, and visiting school districts, in school programs and student activities. The School Board welcomes visits to school buildings and school property by parents, community members, full-time PSEO students, visiting students who are enrolled in other districts, and visiting school districts, provided the visits are consistent with the health, education and safety of students and employees and are conducted within the procedures and requirements established by the school district.
- B. The School Board reaffirms its position on the importance of maintaining a school environment that is safe for students and employees and free of activity that may be disruptive to the student learning process or employee working environment.

III. POST-SECONDARY ENROLLMENT OPTIONS STUDENTS

- A. A student enrolled in a post-secondary enrollment options course(s) may remain at the school site during regular school hours in accordance with established procedures.
- B. A student enrolled in a post-secondary enrollment options course(s) May 18 be provided with reasonable access, during regular school hours, to technology resources that the student needs to complete coursework for a post-secondary enrollment course(s) in accordance with established procedures.

IV. VISITOR LIMITATIONS

- A. An individual or group may be denied permission to visit a school or school property or such permission may be revoked if the visitor(s) does not comply with the school district procedures and regulations or for other reasons, as determined by the Superintendent or designee.
- B. An individual or group who enters school property without complying with

the procedures and requirements may be required to leave school district property and/or may be issued a no trespass notice. The consequences for trespass on school district property will be enforced pursuant to state law.
