RECOGNITIONS

Dr. Santiago-Marullo introduced Senior High School Principal Yvonne O'Shea who spoke about DECA. She said it is an academic competitive club and centered on business. She said there are eight students who qualified for the DECA International Career Development Conference being held in Anaheim, California at the end of the month. Alex Crane and Owen Dragomani took third place in the New York State Conference in Travel and Tourism Team Decision Making. Samantha O'Connell and Sarah Klein took fourth place at the New York State Conference in Sports and Entertainment Marketing Team. Taylor Lamy and Camryn Burrell took fourth place at the New York State Conference in Buying and Merchandising Team Decision Making. Anna Schwarzweller and Ajla Karabegovic took sixth place in the New York State Conference in Travel and Tourism Team Decision Making. The students received certificates for their accomplishments.

Boys Swimming Section V Individual Champion

Dr. Santiago-Marullo introduced Boys Swimming and Diving Coach Brett Leader. Coach Leader asked Jared Ritz to join him. He said Jared is an excellent leader by example and displays that quality on a daily basis. He said from a competitive standpoint he makes his mark. He achieved a state qualified time in seven out of eight events. He broke six school records. He was the sectional champion in the 200 Freestyle. Coach Leader said he couldn't be more proud of Jared and the young man he has become. Jared will be attending Xavier University in the fall. He was presented with a certificate acknowledging his accomplishment.

Indoor Track and Field Section V Champions

Superintendent Santiago-Marullo introduced Indoor Track and Field Coach Bob Goodell who spoke about the Section V champions. Coach Goodell first thanked the School Board and the Athletic Department for providing the young athletes with the tremendous opportunity to participate in indoor track and field. There were track meets that took place early Saturday mornings and some meets ran well into the evening. He said the athletes had a great season and provided great leadership. Jenna Strickland, Erika Tillotson, Payton Elliott, and Sarah Urban broke a school records that was standing for over ten years. They worked very hard together over the past two years to accomplish their goal of being the Section V Champions in the 4x400m Relay. Nico Bellavia, Kyle Bensink, Connor Preston and Alex Gonnella were equally successful in their 4x400m Relay. They not only broke their school record from last year, they had a great showing at sectionals and broke the school record as well as being the Section V Champions. Coach Goodell said it has been his pleasure to coach this group of young men and women. They are extremely dedicated and work very hard. They are tremendous leaders on the team and represent Victor High School and Victor Track extremely well. The athletes were presented with certificates acknowledging their accomplishments.

CAMPUS NEWS

VCS administrators summarized campus news and events.

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FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENT PRESENTATION

Superintendent Santiago-Marullo introduced Senior High School Principal Yvonne O'Shea who spoke about the Foreign Exchange Program. Mrs. O'Shea thanked the Board of Education for allowing the District to accept foreign exchange students each year. She said as much as they learn from us we learn from them as well. She then introduced Guarav Deepak Revankar from India and Camilla Guediche from Italy along with each of their host families. Eduardo Canto Flamenco from Mexico was unable to attend the meeting because he is on vacation with his family. Each student provided an overview of their country, town or city they are from, their families from home, and their cultures. The students talked about the differences between their educational settings back home and the educational setting at Victor Central Schools. Mrs. O'Shea presented on behalf of Eduardo Flamenco. Board President, Debbie Palumbo-Sanders thanked the students for presenting to the Board of Education. She also thanked the host families for opening their homes to the students.

SECONDARY DISTRICT GOALS UPDATE

Superintendent Santiago-Marullo introduced Junior High School Principal Brian Gee and Senior High School Principal Yvonne O'Shea who presented a secondary District goals update. Mr. Gee started out by talking about improving academic achievement and performance for every student. During the 2016-2017 school year, all students will engage in ongoing learning opportunities aligned to the District vision for student academic achievement leading to 100% of the students achieving proficiency or mastery on the anchor standards for their courses. This will be measured by their end-of-year summative assessments. Mr. Gee said some of the work the Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) have been focusing on is time, task and product. If we focus on deep learning student tasks, instructional time spent, and student work products then we will see an increase in the learning opportunities aligned to the District vision for student academic achievement. This helps students to become deeper thinkers. Mr. Gee then highlighted some of the work that is taking place in 7th grade science. They are rethinking assessment results by looking into how to use student performance to further learning. Science teachers are learning by collaborating and reworking a problem. He then talked about the assessment mapping work taking place in the social studies department. The initial work was to create an item analysis map. The hope was that over the next year or two it would lead to redesigning the final assessments. The social studies department started by analyzing questions, and focused on balancing questions to address all standards. Mr. Gee then went over what the social studies assessment map looked like. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders said it seems like a creative

way to go about it. Mr. Gee said it was agreed upon that there needed to be more direct data. He then talked about the social emotional goal of focusing on the engagement of students in new opportunities to develop social, emotional, and physical well-being. He discussed Andrea Tait's mindfulness and meditation program. Mindfulness is a series of meditation techniques or practices that slow the mind and fix attention on the present. He went over what it looks like in Mrs. Siesto's social studies classroom setting by using brain breaks. This break moves the kids off the content and the stress from learning and allows them to re-engage. She is finding the amount of redirection she has to use is much less. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders said the brain breaks are just 2-3 minutes. Mr. Gee said yes. They are very brief.

Mrs. O'Shea then reviewed the Senior High School District Goals. She said at the beginning of the year she asked the teachers to pick an academic goal in one of three areas to increase authentic and relevant experiences, incorporating additional literacy instruction or utilizing new technologies. In the area of authentic and relevant experiences Mrs. O'Shea talked about how three of the District's English Language Learner (ELL) students were inspired by a guest speaker in Mike Muscarella's Global History class who spoke about the Uganda Water Project. The three students teamed up with the Global Competency Certificate (GCC) and Key Club to raise awareness and funding for this water project. They sponsored a walk on March 29th which raised \$4,142.25 (well beyond their goal of \$3,500) to purchase a water tank for a high school in Uganda. In the area of utilizing new technology Mrs. O'Shea talked about the wireless probes purchased by the science department. She also spoke about the new 3-dimensional printer that was acquired last spring. Students in all of the Project Lead The Way (PLTW) courses as well as the Robotics team have been using the printer. The third goal is incorporating additional literacy instruction. More than half of the English teachers have added the concept of adding 15-20 minutes of sustained reading at the beginning of every class. To make it successful it has to be thoughtfully guided. Teachers have found that kids really value this time. In their busy lives they don't have this kind of time to read. Mrs. O'Shea then spoke about the goal around social emotional wellness. In November a culture survey was given to all students by grade level asking them how they feel about their high school. Results of the November culture surveys were analyzed at Department Chair, Instructional Support Team, and whole faculty meetings. During the March 24th conference day, teachers worked in mixed groups to analyze student and teacher feedback to find trends and potential areas

for improvement. Mrs. Ballard asked if all of the English teachers are incorporating the reading at the beginning of each class period or just a sample. Mrs. O'Shea said there are between nine and ten of the thirteen teachers that have incorporated it so far. Mr. Gilbert asked how we ensure that we get survey results from our most at risk students and those that don't participate. Mrs. O'Shea said they went into the Boost classroom and asked the students to do a second survey.

2017-2018 SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET

Dr. Santiago-Marullo introduced Business Official Mike Vistocco and Director of Human Resources Jim Haugh who provided a revised budget presentation. Mr. Vistocco said the 2017-2018 proposed budget is \$66,352,887, which is an increase of \$1,250,016 or 1.92%. He said it is an increase from the draft budget the Board originally received because the District received additional state aid after the state finalized the budget. The budget to budget increase is still at the tax cap maximum. There is no tax rate increase budget to budget. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders asked if we are still able to decrease the reliance on reserves. Mr. Vistocco said yes it was decreased by \$50,000. He said that number did not change from the last presentation. The only number that changed was the state aid change. Mr. Haugh then provided a compressed list by building of the staffing increases now that the state has passed the budget. In the Early Childhood School there is placeholder for Kindergarten based on enrollment, 1 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Special Education Teacher, 1 FTE School Counselor and .5 FTE Academic Intervention Service (AIS) Teacher. The Primary School will receive the other .5 AIS teaching position and 1 FTE School Counselor. At the Intermediate School the 1 FTE School Counselor position that was funded by a grant last year will be absorbed into the budget. The Junior High School will be receiving 1 FTE School Psychologist position, 1 FTE Office Support position as well as 1 FTE in either French or Science. Dr. Santiago-Marullo said this position will be reported in the News Magazine as 1 FTE for the Junior High School. The Senior High School will be receiving 1 FTE High School Assistant Principal. Mr. Haugh said other positions being added to the District include 1 FTE Office Support position between the Facilities and Transportation Departments, 1 FTE Lifeguard to help with physical education classes and 1 FTE Cleaner. Mr. Haugh said we are able to reach positions to bring us back to the pre-budget crisis staffing stage. Mr. DeLucia said he felt it was important for him to be a part of this meeting and was happy that he could be attend through videoconferencing. He said Dawn and her staff have done an excellent job to foresee possible additional funding. They help us build the resources necessary to create great programming for children. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders said we have been pretty lean on staffing since the down turn in the budget.

We are fortunate to be able to increase staffing. Dr. Santiago-Marullo said she would like to speak on behalf of the administrative team to say we are glad we are now able to add staffing and want to thank all of the staff who has worked hard over the years to keep us going. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders said while we cannot add everything back immediately we can at least start adding.

Policy 6210, School Tax Assessment and Collection, is also a Victor Central School District only policy. It is just restating the law and doesn't add anything to the policy manual. She said the other policies have been reviewed by the administrators they involve. After discussion the Board of Education decided to rescind policy 6210, School Tax Assessment and Collection at the May Board meeting.

Mr. DeLucia said that a few years back the District heard from Assemblyman Brian Kolb that sometimes they don't hear from Districts when they do good work. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders attended the International Baccalaureate Art Show. She said the artists put a lot of heart into their work. She also attended the BOCES Open House at the Technical and Career Center in Flint, NY. She said she met up with Anna Bauer who presented to the Board of Education last month.

Mrs. Ballard and Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders attended the community forum for the Primary School principal search.

Mr. Gilbert said he attended *The Little Mermaid* and it was incredible. He said he is so impressed year after year with the high quality musicals. Kudos to the kids and staff for a wonderful performance.

Dr. Santiago-Marullo said she was part of a conference call yesterday with Matt Nelligan who is the Chief of Staff for Senator Funke. He originally wanted to talk about what to focus on if the budget was not passed. Even though the budget did pass he kept the meeting to ask what the School Superintendent's would like the Senator to focus on. Dr. Santiago-Marullo said they talked about the policy issues with Teacher Retirement System Reserve and the Special Education Reserve knowing those items would protect our budget. Dr. Santiago-Marullo said the conference call not only involved some Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES Superintendents but also some Monroe County School Superintendents. She said there are actually bills for both of these reserves. Mrs. Palumbo-Sanders said the District has had some great fiscal management over the years.

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Miscellaneous Continued Mr. DeLucia asked District Clerk Maureen Goodberlet for guidance on the status of the Victor Central School District Board of Education joining the Monroe County School Boards Association. Mrs. Goodberlet said since January she has been working with Sherry Johnson, Executive Director of Monroe County School Boards Association on allowing the Victor Board of Education to join Monroe County School Boards Association. As of today she informed me that the Monroe County School Board Officers have a proposal that is working its way through the appropriate channels. They are hoping to have an answer after their next executive committee meeting on April 26th.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION Victor Teachers' Association President Mike Modleski spoke about his opportunity to speak with the Commissioner on untimed testing. She was asked if data on untimed testing was being tracked and the answer was no. Mr. Modleski is asking advocacy groups to consider advocating for tracking this information.
