

Unity Of Control

Only decisions of the Board acting as an entity are binding on the Superintendent.

Accordingly:

1. Decisions or instructions of individual Board members, officers or committees are not binding on the Superintendent except in rare instances when the Board has specifically authorized such exercise of authority by individuals or committees.
2. In the case of Board members or committees requesting information or assistance without Board authorization, the Superintendent may refuse such requests that require, in the Superintendent's opinion, a material amount of staff time or resources or that are disruptive or unreasonable.
