BUSINESS AND FINANCE DIRECTOR THERESA MCLACHLAN, C.P.A. Elementary School Improvement Team: Allyson Hanna-Shelters, Sheryl Noble-Allen Tammy Holt-Shelters, Melissa Kochanoski-Grogan, Shannon Plocharczyk-Fordline and Ali Kopp-Fordline, School Improvement Team members, each took a turn highlighting; the goals, strategies, progress toward goals, evidence of progress, changes for 2018/19 and the success stories from the elementary buildings.

Curriculum/Federal PROGRAMS DIRECTOR Dr. MICHELLE BAKER-HERRING

Goals, growth and proficiency and the demonstration of each. Continued work toward increased student engagement, high order thinking skills in content area are focused on, setting students up for success. Research based strategies such as TPT, professional development-that provides teachers with training and support continue to assist with the progress being made. Success is being seen through MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support), all buildings are exceeding proficiency in ELA and Math. Young 5's (formerly TK) data shows students have benefited from this growth year. 100% of current kindergarten students, who attended the Young 5's program, are at or above their grade level in ELA.

> Changes for 18/19; updating the safety and security plan, focus on 3rd grade reading legislation with programming and support specific to that, continued work on increasing the focus on the social/emotional skills of students and expand instructional rounds

Success Stories; building relationships with parents, community and the schools through activities such as Math Nights, Reading Nights, Book Bingo, W.A.T.C.H. Dogs, after school tutoring, festivals and field trips to name a few. These events and activities continue to encourage participation and enhance the elementary experience for our students, teachers and families.

Discussion took place about teaching strategies, school safety concerns and the need for elementary counseling to help students that seem to be struggling now more than ever with social/emotional skills.

<u>Construction Update:</u> Rob Kakoczki-Plante Moran CRESA, updated the board on the current state of the construction projects around the district. The financial reports are to the penny, everything matches between the district's business office and PMC accounting office. The budget is up-to-date. Work for 2016, 2017 has been checked off. For 2018, roof replacement at AHS is currently on schedule with a kick off meeting this Friday, also working on pricing for furniture replacement at the schools. Sound/lighting and curtain replacement was wrapped up at AHS auditorium in early February. Punch list and late delivery items are being completed. Site restoration and touch ups will continue this spring. Discussion took place about; the contingency funds and how they will be spent, AHS bathroom replacement project and additional projects if the funds permit. All bond proceeds have to be spent by February of 2020.

DISCUSSION

<u>Finance</u>-Ms. McLachlan updated the board on the employee severance plan. EPC informed her we currently have twelve teachers that have fully elected the plan. Nine of these are from the General Fund, three are Act 18. Two other employees have been working on their paperwork with an intent to submit this week, these employees are from General Fund which would bring the total to eleven. The election window expires April 13. Those who have elected can revoke it by April 20th. We have met our goal and will proceed. Discussion took place regarding the effective dates for retiring teachers.

<u>Curriculum</u>-Dr. Baker-Herring informed the board the test for our English Learners-WIDA Testing has been completed. 81 students were tested at all 8 buildings. M-Step, for some elementaries, began today as well as the SAT and PSAT 8/9. 5th Grade M-Step testing continues tomorrow as well as Work Keys for 11th grade and PSAT 10 for 10th grade. 8th grade M-Step begins next week. M-Step testing for 5th, 8th and 11th grade must be complete by May 4th. 3rd and 4th grade testing begins the week of April 30th and must be completed by May 25th. The Michigan School Index System, (the new way our schools are being held accountable, replacing the Accountability Scorecard and the Top-to-Bottom Rankings) was released on April 3rd after a month long preview window where districts across the state were reported to the MDE and the data was uploaded. This new system measures public school performance in six key areas; student growth, student proficiency, school quality/student success, graduation rate, English Learner progress and assessment participation.

Schools receive credit in each area based on the degree to which it meets its targets and an overall index value ranging from 0-100. The Michigan School Index System is used to identify schools for support. None of our schools were identified for support as Asher was removed from the Priority School List. Dr. Baker-Herring plans to give a more in depth view of the system when she presents the District Improvement Plan in May.

<u>Superintendent</u>-Ms. Pastor announced the complete closure of Leroy Street, between Cameron and Drake, in both directions, for all pedestrian and vehicle traffic beginning Monday, April 16, 2018 and lasting for approximately 3 weeks. This closure is part of an underground sewer repair. This affects AHS, DMS, Asher and anyone who travels in between.

Ms. Pastor encouraged students to keep showing us their best, it is not too late to turn a poor grade into a better grade. Students should set goals and make a plan on how to achieve those goals, we believe all students are capable.

Spring count numbers are in, we lost approximately 75 students from the fall count. We gained students at the K-5 level and at Beacon. Nineteen were lost from DMS. Forty five from AHS and thirty nine from Asher.

Ms. Pastor extended thanks to all dedicated members of the Southgate School Staff. She thanked them for coming to work with a positive attitude to make a difference for our students. She asked staff to please consider telling someone thank you, or that they noticed how hard they are working. There is actual science behind how showing gratitude makes us happier people. We are quick to react when we don't like something that has happened, or want to call and complain on social media. Someone's day can be made by saying thank you. She shared a letter that was sent to Mr. Pinkowski today from the Airport Jets Girls Soccer Team. Coach Bobby complimented our Girls Soccer coach, as well as staff, for providing a positive experience during their game. The letter commented on the coach's hospitality while they were in Southgate and the excellent manner in which he treated the girls and his positive coaching style. Ms. Pastor commented that it only takes a minute to send a positive note. Discussion took place about student counts, yearly trends, staffing issues
