What is

“ACCESS TIME”?

Access time is to be used for academic intervention or make-up. Students that are not in need of these services, must use this time productively and may not disrupt the learning of others. If students wish to seek help in a class other than that in which they were assigned, they must request a pass from the teacher they wish to see prior to the start of Access



To update curriculum and align with Lakeland High School, Timberlake High School will discontinue the advanced diploma option for students who graduate after the class of 2019. Advanced opportunities pathways will be implemented in the fall of 2019. Advanced opportunities allocates \$4,125.00 to each student to use toward dual credit/IDLA courses/AP Exams/CTE Certification Exams. Students who complete the following credits will be recognized at graduation.

College/University pathway: College level courses

which satisfy both high school and college requirements are available to qualifying juniors and seniors choosing this pathway. Students have access to numerous college credits on our campus paid for by the state of Idaho. Seniors completing 12 college credits will be given a silver cord to wear at graduation. Seniors completing 25 college credits will be given silver and maroon intertwined cords to wear at graduation.

Career/technical pathway. Students can choose to access coursework to earn industry certification in several career fields through KTEC(Kootenai Technical Education Consortium). Students can also earn technical competency credits in classes offered on our campus. Seniors completing 700 hours of coursework with an 80% average or higher and passed the industry certification exam will be given an intertwined black and silver cord to wear at graduation.

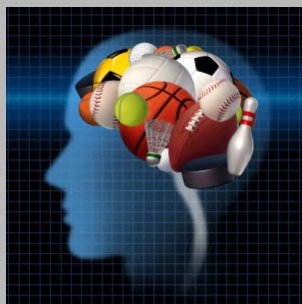
Physical Exam & Interim Questionnaire Forms

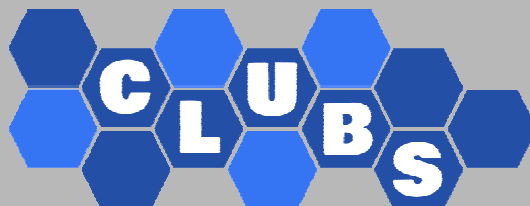

3M SAFETY FILM INSTALLED



Every school in the district has had 3M safety film installed on all entrances to the buildings. 3M safety film provides extra time by helping to deter unwanted individuals from entering the building. It is not bulletproof, but it will keep the window from shattering and falling on impact. It is also blast resistant to a point, it is the same film that is installed on military and navy bases.

This film will provides the precious extra minutes we need to get our students to safety.

TRACK RESURFACED

It has been 20 years since Timberlake High School installed its original outdoor track, Resurfacing should occur every 10 years. The heavy traffic it sees from high school athletes, physical education classes, youth sports participants and community events warranted this update.



DISC GOLF COURSE INSTALLED

The University of Idaho and Lakeland School District partnered to create a unique experience for community members and students alike. Timberlake teacher, Shawn Lawler had a vision to create a disc



golf course at the High School and found a disc golf course installation expert and Ph.D. student to help turn his vision into a reality. Disc golf is a new, fun, and exciting sport that can be enjoyed by people of all ages and abilities. Much like traditional golf, players try to complete the course in as few “strokes” as possible. Disc golf players traverse a course by throwing “discs” from a “tee pad” instead of swinging clubs and they try to get the disc to rest in the basket at the end of each hole. The entire course can be played in roughly 30 minutes.

Since the course is a “Pitch and Putt” style course, players will only be permitted to use their “Putters” for throwing much like a miniature golf course. If you like miniature golf, you will love disc golf. Putters are only \$10 for purchase at local sports retailers, there are no greens fees, and you can play against yourself or friends in a lifelong sport that is fun, challenging, and low impact. For people looking to exercise and have fun doing it, disc golf is the sport for you!

2018-2019 Senior Picture Yearbook Information

Welcome to senior year!! There will be many milestones that will be coming up. Senior photos are one of them! If at any time you have questions, please don't hesitate to let us know how we can be of help.

When are they due? Seniors pictures are due on **Friday, September 28 at 3:00 pm.**

Can I turn it in late? No. If the photo is not submitted on time, the senior's ASB photo will be used instead.

Does a professional have to do them? No. *HOWEVER*, photos must be submitted digitally and must be of professional quality, (at least 300 dpi in resolution, in **jpeg format, and sent as an attachment**).

Are there certain photos that work best? YES! Photos off phones do not work well. There are some that do; however, the ones that don't outweigh the good ones by quite a bit. Why? Every time a photo is downloaded, the device compresses the quality of the photo. We see this A LOT, especially with the increase of photos being used on social media, etc. *OUR SUGGESTION* is not to take your photo on a phone.

How should I submit the photo and quote? Email both to Mrs. Jenson at jjenson@lakeland272.org. Use the legal name we have on file in the office. **Order: Last Name, First Name Example: Brown, Joeseeph**

What should the photo look like? The picture **must be a vertical photo**. A sharp focus portrait from the torso up is preferred, faces must be in full view. Portraits might need to be cropped to fit. Being that we are a publication for the school and community, **please refer to the following requirements**. Attire worn must satisfy the school dress code. Props must be pre-approved by the adviser prior to being used in the photo submitted for the THS yearbook. It is the right of the THS administration and the yearbook adviser to determine what is deemed acceptable for publication. If a photo is submitted that does not follow these requirements, the student's ASB photo will be used in the place of the photo that is submitted. **All decisions are final.**

How will we know you've received the photo? A list will be updated outside room 201. *Seniors are responsible for checking to be certain their photos have arrived and have been accepted by the deadline.* The advisor will acknowledge receipt of photos through email as they arrive. If a request for a change is made, it will be on the senior to resubmit before September 28th. We will post a proof of the layout with the student photo and quote outside of room 201. Although yearbook staff members strive to avoid all mistakes, the seniors are responsible for checking for the accuracy of the photos, spelling, etc. The yearbook will not be responsible for errors not presented to the adviser.

What about the Quotes? Each quote must be twelve words or less (this can depend on the size of the words. Please, refer to the current book for example of quote sizes). **Quotes are also due September 28th by 3pm.** Please, include them in the email with the photo. Quotes must be school appropriate. The yearbook staff reserves the right to ask anyone to choose an alternate quote.

What about Senior Ads and Baby Photos? We would LOVE to build a senior ad for you and your family. **This is a fantastic place to add baby photos, "We're proud of you" tributes, etc. that you and your family can look back on for years to come! These will be due in February.** We can build an ad for you, build it with you at a senior ad design night, or give feedback on an ad that you design and submit yourself. We are here to help! Senior ad information will be available at registration. Look for our information sheet on prices, sizes, etc. at registration. Don't miss out on this opportunity. *We only have a few spots available.*

Please be aware of the deadline and plan properly. This will help your family make this a true documentation of the milestone that it is. Due to our deadline to our publisher, September 28th is not an arbitrary date. We are obligated to meet our own deadline and each photo not submitted on time delays our ability to do so. If you plan to use a professional photographer, we highly suggest making your family's plans well in advance. They will be booking early and must have time to process and edit photos. Please, let me know if you have any questions, etc. We would love to help you make this a special time for your family.

What is the SAT College & Career Readiness Benchmark?

“Students are considered college-and career-ready when their SAT section scores meet both the math and the Evidence-based Reading and Writing benchmarks...

Students with an SAT Math section score that meets or exceeds the benchmark have a 75% chance of earning at least a C in the 1st semester, credit-bearing college courses in algebra, statistics, pre-calculus, or calculus.

Students with an SAT Evidence-Based Reading & Writing (ERW) section score that meets or exceeds the benchmark have a 75% chance of earning at least a C in 1st semester credit-bearing college courses in history, literature, social sciences, or writing classes.”

The ERW benchmark score = 450

The Math benchmark score = 530

\$175.00 Century Business Membership gives you voting rights and 2 Booster Club Passes that provided entrance to all home games (THS & TJHS) for you and anyone you allow to use the card. Excluding tournaments.
