Members of the 5th and 6th Grades competed in the Montgomery County Math 24 Tournament in May. Math 24 is a fast-paced mathematics program which builds strong mental mathematics and problem-solving skills. The challenge is to create equations that total 24 by using all numbers on each card and any combination of addition, subtraction, multiplication or division. Wyndcroft's students were very successful again this year. We had two 5th Grade Semi-Finalists - **Shreyas Motupalli and Devin Patel** - and one 6th Grade Finalist - **Siddharth Karthik**.



On Saturday May 19th, Sixth graders participated in the Philadelphia Solar Sprint Competition. Students created and tested solar sprint cars at the Drexel Armory during a cloudy, rainy morning. All students enjoyed the competition that involved working together as a team and making numerous adjustments to their cars on the fly during the competition. Afterwards they were treated to a tour of the Drexel Engineering Lab where they got to see a Scanning Electron Microscope, X-Ray Diffraction Machines, and Lasers!


Highest GPA award was earned by Morgan Kachmar as the member of the Class of 2018 with the most outstanding academic record.

WHY I SUPPORT WYNDCROFT THROUGH EITC: RICHARD ALBRIGHT '68

Richard Albright '68 is among those who've made Wyndcroft the beneficiary of their Pennsylvania EITC (Educational Improvement Tax Credit) gifts. He says the EITC was a no-brainer and a good opportunity to provide scholarship help for the deserving, because he knows the importance of scholarships firsthand.

"I recall when finishing sixth grade I was set to go to public school because Dad actually told me we couldn't afford to keep me [at Wyndcroft] for the final two years. To this day I don't know the details of what happened but Dad told me that Wyndcroft made some arrangements that allowed me to finish the last two years. I remember at the time it seemed like a pardon from the governor. ... I think the last two years at Wyndcroft were very important because otherwise I would have missed the Snively years. Made a big difference in who I am today."

50 years after his Wyndcroft graduation, Rich is a successful Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist in the Lehigh Valley, with 36 years of experience. He tells us he's got Sir Walter Scott's *Ivanhoe*, which we all read in the 8th grade under Headmaster Carlisle Snively, downloaded on his Kindle for rereading. "After 50 years the memories of that book are still fresh."

OUR ARCHIVES ARE GROWING

We were most grateful to receive these recent gifts of archival materials for our growing historical collection.

From Eliza Marshall Baird '60, a Wyndcroft cookbook and a photograph of the cast of a lower school play ca. 1952, all standing on the outdoor stage in front of the Four Year Kindergarten/Art Building (erected 1919, moved from our original location at the Hill School to our present campus 1925, demolished 1967 for the present 1968 brick classroom building that stands to the left of our present Main Entrance.)

From Rita Conger Banning '43, ca. 1940 snapshots of teachers Miss Obie (Angeline V. Oberholtzer) and Mrs. Guss, and of two of the three many-windowed frame classroom bungalows erected on our present campus in 1925 (demolished 1949 when the extension to the old Main Building at Rosedale and Wilson was erected).

From Lou Jeffries, Archivist of the Hill School, copies of priceless photographs of some of our earliest students, including Marcia Meigs, daughter of Headmaster Dwight Meigs of the Hill School and great-granddaughter of its founder Matthew Meigs. Dwight Meigs hired a governess for Marcia in 1916, and so that she wouldn't be lonely he formed a little nursery school. This nursery school was the forerunner of Wyndcroft, founded in 1918.

From the Rev. Dr. Keith E. Jones '59, class and individual pictures from his Wyndcroft years including a group photo on a 1953 class trip to the Philadelphia Airport, Commencement, pageant and Field Day programs, dishes, and a pocket patch emblazoned with the old Wyndcroft Lamp of Learning logo, and the Graduation Certificate awarded to him at Commencement on May 27, 1959.

From R. Elliott Speer, son of Elizabeth "Betty" Lester '29, the composer of the Wyndcroft Alma Mater, and daughter of John A. Lester, Ph.D. and his wife Margaret, two of the founders of Wyndcroft, two photographs of Betty as a young woman, one by the noted photographer George Platt Lynes.

We are always delighted to receive Wyndcroft memorabilia! You are welcome to send us originals or scans of photographs (jpeg preferred), digitized videos, and items you want preserved. We are especially looking for photographs or videos that show the campus in earlier stages of growth. When we assemble enough images we hope to create a digital reconstruction of the campus as it was in, say, 1925, 1949, 1961, and later intervals.


