Celebrating Board President Benny May's 20 years of service

This summer was a milestone for BHISD Board of Trustees President Benny May, when he marked his 20th anniversary of service to the students, staff, and community of Barbers Hill.



“Benny has been in a leadership role in one of the most dynamic times in our district’s history,” said Superintendent Dr. Greg Poole. “Having the continuity of a stable Board is one of the key ingredients to keeping Barbers Hill “Barbers Hill,” even in the midst of remarkable growth and change.”

When May first began his service on the Board, he and his wife Lori, who serves as a counselor at BH Elementary North, had two small children, Myles and Makenzi, beginning their school years as Eagles. Today both children are BH grads and young adults.

Asked what first led him to run for a position on the BHISD School Board in 1996, May responded,

“I wanted to make a positive difference in the lives of children, and I wanted to do my part to ensure that our school district maintained the level of excellence that was already established many years before my time.”

During May’s 20 years of service, he has indeed continued that level of excellence through four bond programs, which all passed by large margins. May is also proud to say that even with recent bond programs, taxes have not been raised in Barbers Hill for more than a decade.

He has also served as a mentor and volunteer in the district, while working in a supervisory role at ExxonMobil in Mont Belvieu.

“I love being a part of the best school district in the state that truly believes in helping our students be successful,” he said.

In addition to May’s service locally, he has also served on the Texas Association of School Board’s Board of Directors for the past nine years. This unique role has allowed him to see public education in Texas from a broader perspective.

“I’ve had the opportunity to be on the selection committee for Superintendent of the Year for the state of Texas (and am currently on this committee for the fourth time). I love learning about the successes as well as challenges of other districts around the state,” he said. “God has blessed my family and me in many ways, and I feel that it’s important that I continue to give back,” May said. “Serving this community and the best school district in the state for over 20 years is a memory that I will cherish for a lifetime.”

Distinguished Alumnus Tony Sims



Tony Sims, Barbers Hill's Distinguished Alumnus 2016, is the current Chambers County Auditor, a leadership coach, and successful business owner. A graduate of the Class of 1983, Tony is also a 7th generation Texan and Barbers Hill native whose family tree includes Amos Barber. He is married to Lori Sims.

"When I think of Tony Sims, two things come immediately to mind," said BHISD Board member George Barrera. "Strong leadership, and the great feeling that a person like him is watching out for my tax dollars. To stand out as a strong leader in a county blessed with many strong leaders is really all that needs to be said, but added to that, he bleeds BLUE!"

Tony attended Sam Houston State University and Rice University Jones Graduate School of Management, and in 2014 became a Certified Public Manager. He has served as an elected and appointed county official since 2010. In addition, he is a speaker and leadership coach with the John Maxwell team and owns Coastal Refractory Services, Inc.

As a county official, Sims has greatly served BHISD and neighboring districts through his work on the Permanent School Fund Committee.

"Whether it be orchestrating leadership seminars, or fiscal management of county monies, Tony Sims is always striving to be part of the solution," said BH Superintendent Dr. Greg Poole. "His leadership has allowed BHISD to receive over \$5 million through the management of school resources."

Honorary Eagle Henry Adair



BHISD's 2016 Honorary Eagle Henry Adair has a lifelong tradition of public service to education and the community. He was born in Hunt County, Texas, in 1940 on a 40-acre cotton farm, and moved to Baytown as a youth. He graduated from Robert E. Lee High School in 1959.

As a teen, Adair hitchhiked to Sam Houston State University and walked on to the football team. He lettered three years and was named to the All-Conference team in 1961. Adair graduated from SHSU in 1963, with a B.S. degree in Physical Education and Industrial Arts.

Adair's primary area of business has been the storage, transport, and trading of hydrocarbons. He is the co-founder of Moss Bluff Storage Facility, and a builder and owner of pipelines.

"Henry Adair may be a Gander, but we claim him all the same!" said BHISD Superintendent Dr. Greg Poole. "Henry has served this community and school district through more than a dozen boards and elected positions. There are few folks that I can call on at any time, regardless of the situation, and know that help will be there. But Henry is one of those people."

Henry moved his family to Barbers Hill in 1981 for the great school system. Together, he and his wife Cynthia have 4 daughters: Jill, Alison, Heidi, and Angela.

A member of the BHISD School Board from 1987-1995 (five of those years as Board President), Adair served our district through the turbulent financial times when "Robin Hood" laws were initiated. Under Adair's skillful leadership, Barbers Hill remained strong.

Attendance has a significant impact on academic achievement. In other words, how often your child comes to school is closely related to success in school! In our research, we've discovered that the students who score at the top of their class also have great attendance. Attendance can impact grades, SAT and ACT scores, and STAAR results. For example, the average attendance rate of the top 10 seniors in BHHS last year was 99%. And the average attendance of the top 10 juniors at BHHS was 98.2%. This is compared to the overall HS attendance rate

of 96.69%. On the other hand, the average attendance rate of the bottom ten students is 92%. Clearly, there is a correlation between attendance and academic achievement.

We want your child to be in school every day so that he or she can be successful. You can help us maximize attendance by scheduling trips, vacations, and appointments on the days we are not in school. When your child is ill, we encourage you to keep him/her home. But as soon as possible, please bring them back to school. We want each and every child to be part of the great things happening in Barbers Hill!



"A Note from TXDOT: Road construction on FM 565"

Construction at the intersection of FM 565-South and FM 3180 will continue through summer 2017. Lane closures while school is in session will be limited to between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm. The project consists of reconstructing the intersection of FM 565 and FM 3180 to provide additional turn lanes, to help relieve congestion and improve safety. Angel Brothers Enterprise, LTD., will perform the construction, with a contracted cost of \$6.4 million.

Meet Athletic Director Tom Westerberg



Coach Tom Westerberg joined the Barbers Hill family as new Athletic Director and Head Football Coach in January. He comes to us from Allen ISD, where he led the Allen Eagles to three state championships since 2012, a 57-game winning streak, and where he earned the title National Coach of the Year in 2014.

"It has been a blast coming into the Barbers Hill community," said Westerberg. "People have been so welcoming to our family. The small town atmosphere is exactly what we were looking for, and the students have been awesome."

Westerberg is joined by his wife, Sandra, and son Kyle, along with Kyle's wife Lindsay and two children. Tom and Sandra also have a son, Lance, who serves overseas in the military, and a daughter, Corri, who is a junior in college.

For the fall, Coach Westerberg knows that many fans will be eagerly watching for changes on the field of Eagle Stadium, and changes there will be.

"We'll have a whole new brand of football this year," he said. "We'll be snapping fast, throwing the ball, and stepping up the tempo.

"With every season, you practice a lot and try to put your athletes through situations similar to the real pressures of competition. I look forward to seeing what our kids can do this season under that pressure....to see if we did a good job coaching."

Westerberg is joined by new defensive coordinator Danny Cowgill, who comes to the Hill from Alabama, and new offensive coordinator Kyle Westerberg. The team will sport new uniforms this season and will be featured on a new scoreboard, which boasts a 24' x 44' video screen and comes to Barbers Hill through the generous contributions of Patients ER and Barbers Hill Bank.

Westerberg urges parents to get involved as much as possible in support of their student athletes, and then to sit back and enjoy the games.

Beyond Friday night lights, he encourages fans to come and witness another piece of history this winter when the first-ever Barbers Hill Varsity Soccer team bursts into action at Eagle Stadium.





The BH Education Foundation last year was ranked #1 in the nation in assets per student, based on an annual study conducted by the research firm Dewey and Associates. At a current value of over \$13 million, the Foundation also ranked #3 in the nation for revenues per student, and is among the largest foundations in Texas.

The BHEF has awarded more than \$325,000 in grants to Barbers Hill teachers and staff for innovative learning projects that enhance student learning.



BHHS ranks #23 in Houston

Barbers Hill High School scored an “A+” recently in the nonprofit Children at Risk annual study of school performance. Out of 171 high schools rated in the greater Houston area, BHHS was ranked #23. When compared statewide, BHHS ranked #68 out of 1159 high schools.

The most recent district-wide ranking in the same study took place in 2015, when Barbers Hill ISD as a whole ranked 28th out of 900 school districts.


