Community Council Meeting Minutes

October 3, 2017

- I. Welcome – District and MHTN representatives were introduced to the council
- II. Bryan Turner DSD Architect  
Mr. Turner shared a powerpoint presentation.  
History of the building
  - a. Original 2-story building – built late 1800's or early 1900's
  - b. 1<sup>st</sup> addition – multipurpose room - 1955
  - c. 2<sup>nd</sup> addition – kindergarten rooms – 1956
  - d. 3<sup>rd</sup> addition – 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade halls – 1969
  - e. Original building torn down – 1970
  - f. 4<sup>th</sup> addition – kitchen – 1976
  - g. 5<sup>th</sup> addition – back hall of classrooms – 1981  
Sustainable Design of new buildings
  - h. Solar orientation – North or South facing windows for natural light
  - i. LED lighting – uses less electricity, last 25 years
  - j. Lighting Control System – senses natural light and adjusts output
  - k. Super insulated
  - l. Ground source heat exchange – uses 55° ground temperature to warm or cool air before it goes through the system to make things more efficient
  - m. Thermal air displacement
  - n. IDEC cooling – indirect/direct evaporative cooling
  - o. Solar Panels on the roof – some new schools produce more energy than they use
  - p. Xeriscape in non-playground areas  
Security
  - q. Exterior doors – always locked
  - r. Access through secure office
  - s. Office has ability to secure each pod/hallway immediately
  - t. Transparency into classrooms – prevents bullying, if needed police can clear building quickly
  - u. Pods have own exits/restrooms
  - v. Security cameras throughout the building
- III. MHTN Blue Sky – Architects took notes as Community Council members gave their input as to what could/should be included if the sky was the limit
  - a. Include West Bountiful's rich history, keep the small-town feel, design a building that fits into the community/Historic District – possible brick or facade the resembles original

- b. Room for an inside event (PTA), large enough for whole school/parent community to fit at the same time
- c. Gym that is separate from cafeteria
- d. Separate bus drop-off and car drop-off
- e. Cat Walk from neighborhood needs to remain open during construction
- f. Keep the walking track
