CRIME AND PUNISHMENT MIDAS Course

How do you handle the most difficult students? Do you dangle a carrot in front of them, doling out rewards? Or do you use the stick of punishment, forcing them to follow the rules? This session will focus on establishing procedures and expectations for student behavior that encourage the development of positive interpersonal skills. Develop a non-confrontational rapport with even the most challenging students. Implement conflict resolution strategies that promote relationship building and mutual understanding over finger-pointing and retribution.
