Personal Financial Literacy

The District has adopted the Wisconsin Model Academic Standards for Personal Financial Literacy (PFL). The PFL Standards encompass the following strands: Relating Income and Education; Money Management; Credit and Debt Management; Planning, Saving and Investing; Becoming a Critical Consumer; Community and Financial Responsibility; Risk Management. The model standards include both content standards and performance standards.
