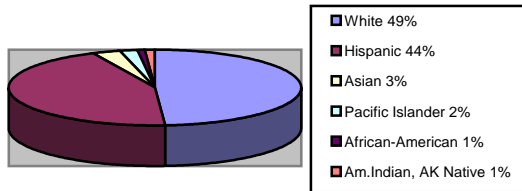
Lodi High School is one of four comprehensive, four-year high schools in a community of approximately 63,000 people. Located in the San Joaquin Valley, Lodi is 40 miles south of Sacramento, the state capital.

Students are challenged by a strong academic curriculum with opportunities in the arts, sciences, math, industrial arts, graphics, social sciences, languages, and speech. Lodi High offers 16 Advanced Placement courses (three in Foreign Languages) as well as 6 Pre-AP/Honors courses. Small learning communities and various academies offer a school-within-a-school approach of integrated curriculum in four subject areas. Classroom programs are supplemented by a wide range of co-curricular experiences for students. Lodi High students have access to 23 men's and women's varsity sports, as well as a variety of service and curriculum related clubs. Lodi High places a premium on maintaining a school environment that promotes academics, diversity, respect, self-esteem and safety.

Accreditation: Lodi High went through an accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges in the Spring of 2017 and was given a 6-year accreditation which extends through June 30, 2023.

Enrollment as of September 2017, is 2189 students.

College Prep (CP) and Honors (H)/Pre-AP or AP courses are offered all four years of high school and meet entrance requirements for the University of California. There are sixteen Advanced Placement and six Pre-AP/Honors courses offered. Three of our Advanced Placement courses are in Foreign Languages; two of the Honors courses are in 9th-10th grades. An extra grade point is awarded for Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors (H)/Pre-AP classes (A=5, B=4, C=3).
