Here are a few words of wisdom regarding digital citizenship. This week, we are focusing on Digital Footprints & Reputation. As the first vice-president of the United Farm Workers of America, Dolores Huerta spent a great deal o her life serving others by working on behalf of American farm workers. Listen to what she had to say about purpose: "We must use our lives to make the world a better place, not just to acquire things. That is what we are put on earth for." School Safety Update

We have conducted many Safety Drills during August at CGIS. We thought this information might be useful so you can discuss these safety drills with your student. We will continue to conduct various drills throughout the school year to do our best to enable students and staff to respond in the best way possible to various potential emergencies. We certainly don't want to scare our students but we do want them to be prepared and know how to respond. - Drills & Sessions conducted without students present for staff only
 - Safety Procedures Overview
 - Training with Window of Life Protocol
 - Scenario Training (Window of Life)
 - Hard Lock Down
 - Soft Lock Down
 - Reverse Evacuation
 - Building Emergency Scenarios (Gas leak, fire, etc.)
 - Medical Emergencies including use of CPR, AED, Epi-pen, etc.
 - Off site evacuation drill
- Drills conducted with students present
 - Fire Drills
 - Tornado Drill
 - Reverse Evacuation (by grade level groups)
 - Hard Lock Down and Soft Lock Down Informational Announcements

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In an emergency, you can improve your chances of survival by quickly deciding which actions to take first. First, take personal protective action. Then, if it is safe to do so, warn others nearby. Next, and if safe to do so, warn and protect others in and around the building or space before calling 911 or emergency services as soon as you can. If others can help, delegate action to get aid faster. Always use your own judgment, since each situation requires a unique response.
