



ReNee Irene Offret Duerden





Niels earned a Purple Heart while serving 18 months as a combat pilot in Vietnam. He also flew missions in support of combat actions in the Dominican Republic, Republic of the Congo, Panama Canal, and Cyprus. During his career, he received numerous medals and distinctions. After serving in the Air Force for 20 years Niels moved his family to Helotes and began his second career as a research analyst for Frost National Bank, progressing to marketing director for Kelly Field National Bank, then associate manager of the San Antonio City Employees Credit Union. The remainder of his career was spent as investment manager for the Air Force Services Agency.
