Community

Spanning 350 square miles, Lodi Unified School District serves the educational needs of Lodi, North Stockton, and the surrounding communities of Acampo, Clements, Lockeford, Morada, Victor, and Woodbridge. Located 35 miles south of Sacramento, in one of the richest agriculture areas of San Joaquin County, Lodi was named Wine Enthusiast Magazine's 2015 Wine Region of the Year. Currently LUSD oversees about 50 sites including preschool programs, 33 elementary schools, 7 middle schools, 4 comprehensive high schools, 2 continuation high schools, alternative education schools of choice, including independent study, community day and Middle College High School, as well as programs for students with disabilities. LUSD's student body of nearly 31,000 has evolved to a population that is 44% Hispanic/Latino, 23% White, 22% Asian/Filipino/Pacific Islander, 7% African American, and 4% other or not reported.

School

Tokay High School is a comprehensive 4 year public high school enrolling approximately 2000 students in grades 9 - 12. The present school site opened in 1977, but was officially established in 1972. Tokay High is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Tokay's student body population is 55% Hispanic/Latino, 30% White, 11% Asian/Filipino/Pacific Islander, 2% African American, and 2% other or not reported.

Curriculum

The academic program follows a 2 semester, modified-traditional schedule. Thirty credits per semester is the typical course load. Students take six, 55-minute classes per school day. Nearly all classes are year-long courses.

The following AP courses are currently offered at Tokay High: Art History, Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Environmental Science, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, Government and Politics: U.S., Human Geography, Microeconomics, Psychology, Physics 1, Spanish Language, Statistics, and U.S. History.

Pre-AP classes are offered in English, Science and Mathematics. Participation in the Pre-AP/AP program is on an open enrollment basis.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation and Rank

GPA is calculated using the associated grade points. Beginning in 9th grade, all subjects and correlated grades are included in this calculation. A minimum of 230 credits is required for graduation, as well as Algebra I (or equivalent). Pre-AP and AP classes are weighted by one point for grades of A, B, or C. Class rank is based on cumulative weighted GPA.

There were 464 graduates in the Class of 2018.

Advanced Placement Results

- In May 2018, 286 Tokay students took AP Exams
- A total of 581 exams were taken in 18 subjects
- 64% of the AP Exams received scores of 3 or higher

- 40% plan to attend 2-year institutions
