Minutes of last meeting – read, motion to approve – Kristen, 2<sup>nd</sup> – April – unanimous approval

SNAP – we will participate in a Walk or Bike to School program. Students will walk or bike to school at least 3 times a week for 4 weeks. Bus students may walk/ride in their neighborhood. See Peach Jar flyer or link on the web page for more info.

Reading Improvement – we are in the middle of DIBELS testing. Then we will determine target instruction with reading TAs. Some TAs will be going into the classroom to work. Results for DIBELS will be reported in October.

Technology Advancement/ Trust Lands reallocation — As part of our SIP goals, \$8,379 was set aside for licenses for ST Math (grades 1-2) and Imagine Math (3-6). We became a banner school for Imagine Math, so our licenses have been provided by them for the next 2 years. We were given a grant for some of the licenses for ST math. Our portion now comes to \$624. A proposal was made to use \$2450 for 5 laptops to help with VEX robotics as part of PLTW; \$1794 for 6 iPads , \$36 for the district MDM fee, and \$119.94 for cases to use as a Kindergarten lab; \$3920 for 8 laptops to add to the 4<sup>th</sup> grade sets to have enough for all students. ## **Current Dress Code:**

### DRESS CODE

West Bountiful recognizes the importance of school, parent, and student collaboration in encouraging students to come to school dressed appropriately. To support our students, this dress code also applies to all staff, volunteers, and visitors. School officials may prohibit the following types of dress or grooming at school or school activities:

- o Clothing, hair, and body should be neat, clean, and modest.
- Extreme or slovenly clothing or excessive, distracting grooming, including but not limited to,
- Extreme hairstyle or colors exaggerated or other than natural colors are prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, mohawks (shaved on sides, middle standing up) or fohawks longer than two inches.
- o Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times. Flip-flops and slippers are not allowed.
- o Hats (including bandanas) **may not** be worn in the school building. Other head accessories may not be wider than 2 inches.
- o Extreme low-rider, sagging or baggy pants or shorts may not be worn. Underwear should never be seen.
- o Summer wear must be modest. Tank tops, halter-tops, spaghetti straps, and midriff tops are not allowed. Shorts may be worn, but must be hemmed and no shorter than 3" from the knee. Skirts may not be shorter than 3" from the knee. Boxers, briefs, or bicycle/spandex shorts are not allowed.
- o Clothing that is torn, ripped, or frayed or has holes is prohibited (unless layered under other clothing).
- o Clothing which displays obscene, vulgar, lewd, disrespectful, or sexually explicit words, messages, or pictures, clothing that can be identified as "gang related", and clothing which shows an illegal substance are not allowed.
- o Clothing attachments or accessories that could be considered weapons or a danger are prohibited.
- o Exaggerated cosmetics, body paint, or body piercing are prohibited.

Parents of students in violation of the dress code may be contacted and asked to bring replacement clothing to school or students may be asked to return home to change and *return to school*.

### **Revised Dress Code:**

### **DRESS CODE**

West Bountiful recognizes the importance of school, parent, and student collaboration in encouraging students to come to school dressed appropriately. School officials may prohibit the following types of dress or grooming at school or school activities:

Clothing, hair, and body should be neat and clean.

Extreme or slovenly clothing or excessive, distracting grooming, including but not limited to,

- o Extreme hairstyles that become distracting in the classroom are not allowed.
- o Footwear must be worn at all times. Slippers are not allowed.
- o Hats (including bandanas) **may not** be worn in the school building. Other head accessories may not be wider than 2 inches.
- o Extreme low-rider, sagging or baggy pants or shorts may not be worn. <u>Underwear should never be seen.</u>
- o Clothing must be school appropriate. Muscle tanks, halter-tops, spaghetti straps, and midriff tops are not allowed. Shorts may be worn, but must have at least a 2" inseam. Boxers, briefs, or bicycle/spandex shorts are not allowed. **Underwear should never be seen**.
- o Clothing which displays obscene, vulgar, lewd, disrespectful, or sexually explicit words, messages, or pictures, clothing that can be identified as "gang related", and clothing which shows an illegal substance are not allowed.
- $\circ \;$  Clothing attachments or accessories that could be considered weapons or a danger are prohibited.
- o Exaggerated cosmetics, body paint, or body piercing are prohibited.

Administration will make final determination about the appropriateness of students' appearance. Parents of students in violation of the dress code may be contacted and asked to bring replacement clothing to school or students may be asked to return home to change and *return to school*.
