3. Celebrations MMS was awarded for closing achievement gaps; positive works--positive works founder has painted a picture from Harvey and the painting will be on loan in the MMS foyer. Counselors will be trained in trauma this year (we have three counselors!) We are almost done with MAP testing.

 1. Campus Improvement Plan
 1. MMS Goals
 1. By June 2019, at least 100% of MMS students will meet or exceed growth expectations. (based on MAP data)
 2. By June 2019, at least 65% of MMS students will respond favorably on school connectedness of the Panorama survey. MMS has developed our own SEL lessons and SBISD has also implemented SEL lessons. Committee discussed variables that may have led to our low school connectedness score (44%). THIS IS OUR NUMBER ONE GOAL.
 3. By June 2019, at least 75% of MMS students will perform at post-secondary-ready levels on the PSAT (390 verbal and 430 math) and/or MAP (66-77th percentile reading, 70-84th percentile math).
 4. By June 2019, MMS will close existing achievement gaps by at least 50% among ELL and At-Risk students while all performance improves.
 2. Vaping Sensors-Update the district says we can't have vape sensors because we are not allowed to have safety measures that are not provided on other campuses. Additionally, if we were to add anything to our bathrooms we would have to update them to code.
 1. Safety Update
 - i. Lockdown, Lockout, Evacuate, Shelter Procedures new signage is in each of the rooms to explain new safety verbage (lockout vs. lockdown)
 - ii. Threat Assessment Procedure new threat protocol-“I’m going to fight such and such” all the way to “I’m going to blow up the school” DA has new protocol for students who threaten harm to the school.
