### MISSION

Founded in the Ursuline tradition and rooted in the Catholic faith, St. Ursula Academy educates each young woman, transforming her through intellectual inquiry, personal growth, spiritual formation, and compassionate service, empowering her to lead confidently in a global society.

### SCHOOL

St. Ursula Academy is a Catholic secondary school for young women sponsored by the Ursuline Sisters of Toledo, Ohio. The school is a college preparatory institution with an enrollment of 545 students in grades 6 through 12, including 449 in the high school.

Acceptance is determined by the Admissions Committee.

St. Ursula Academy draws its student body from northwest Ohio and southeast Michigan. A large number of students have attended Catholic elementary schools; a smaller number come from public and other private elementary schools.

### ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS PROGRAMS

A broad range of students in grades 10, 11, and 12 elect to participate in AP courses. During the 2018-2019 school year, more than 51 percent of students in these grades have elected to take at least one AP course.

#### St. Ursula offers 21 AP courses with syllabi approved through The College Board:

Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Comparative Government, Computer Science Principles, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, French, Human Geography, Latin, Music Theory, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Studio Art: Drawing, U.S. Government and Politics, and U.S. History.

Additionally, St. Ursula Academy offers the prestigious AP Capstone Program, which is composed of **AP Seminar** and **AP Research**. This program focuses on collaboration, communication, and research, culminating in a capstone project.

During the 2017-2018 academic year, SUA had 124 students take 281 AP exams. Eighty-four percent of the AP test scores were 3 or higher.

#### SUA offers 18 Honors courses:

Algebra I, Algebra II, Anatomy & Physiology, Bella Voce Chamber Ensemble, Biology & Lab, Chamber Ensemble, Chemistry & Lab, Concert Choir, English I, French IV, Geometry, Latin IV, Modern World History, Pre-Calculus, Physics & Lab, Satellite Remote Sensing, Spanish IV, and Yearbook Design.

Students may take classes at local universities or colleges through the College Credit Plus program. St. Ursula Academy partners with The University of Toledo to offer Introduction to Engineering, a course for students concurrently enrolled in AP Calculus.

### CORE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION:

**English** (4.5), **Math** (4), **Science** (3), **Social Studies** (3), **World Language** (2), **Theology** (4), **Technology** (.5), **Health** (.5), **Fine Arts** (1), **Physical Education** (.5), **Business** (.5), **Leadership** (.25), **Electives** (8).

1 credit = 2 terms, .5 credit = 1 term (except P.E. = .5 credit)

Students are required to complete a Career Exploration Project and 60 hours of community service by the end of their Junior year.

## COUNSELING

All students are assigned a school counselor. Beginning freshman year, students meet with the college counselor to receive direction and support for the college selection process.

## CURRICULUM

St. Ursula Academy operates on the 4x4 Collegiate Block Schedule with two terms in each semester. The first semester is from August through December, and the second semester is from January through May. Credit is granted each term.

## GRADING SCALE AND GPA

St. Ursula Academy does not rank its students. At the end of the final term of senior year, valedictorians and salutatorians are identified by GPA. St. Ursula Academy grades on a weighted four-point system designed to give added weight to AP and Honors courses when calculating the GPA.
