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

## Literacy Audit

Designed to address district specific questions, this service can provide a pulse on current K-12 literacy programs.

The audit process can be completed with a focus on curriculum alignment, resource implementation, assessment data or program status. Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES personnel will work with district personnel to develop a framework that meets the districts' needs.





### Zearn Math Support Service

Zearn Math is a free comprehensive learning experience that engages students in Kindergarten - Grade 5 in both adaptive digital content and small group targeted instruction with a teacher to help maximize the potential for all students to learn and love math. Zearn is based on the NYS Engage NY Math Modules by Eureka Math Inc. and was built by teachers to be a part of your daily core math time.

To help maximize the Zearn Service, Andy Mitchell, Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES Coordinator of Regional Math Initiatives, will work with districts to provide:

- Kick-off training for teachers and administrators (one day in-district)
  - Introduce the program and how it can maximize student learning
  - Highlight examples on how to increase classroom personalization through individualized lessons and student data reports
  - Brainstorm ways to make math block planning more efficient
  - Year-long consultation with building and district level leaders to maximize the impact of Zearn
- Year-long coaching of teachers with a focus on data management and targeted instruction within the Zearn instructional framework
- Additional support as needed, based upon identified school needs

#### 2018-2019 Cost:

- 5 days of in-person support and coaching with Andy Mitchell = \$3,900
  - Zearn Math Administrative Tools Add-On Package (\$2,500 per school)
    - Licenses (and pricing) are by school, which gives administrators access to building-level student learning data.
    - Zearn school licenses run from July 1 through June 30.
- Additional in-district coaching days can be purchased as needed, based on identified school needs.

# Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools

Cornell University developed the Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) model for residential care as part of its Residential Child Care Project in the early 1980's. The foundations of this curriculum are in research based literature and programs. In 2007 Cornell responded to requests from various Board of Cooperative Education (BOCES) Centers and other public schools and adapted the TCI curriculum to meet the needs of schools. Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools (TCIS) gives WFL BOCES a framework for implementing a crisis prevention and management system that reduces the need to rely on high-risk interventions, complements the Response to Intervention (RTI) approach and includes aspects of trauma informed care.

There are three main competencies taught in the TCIS Training:

Competency 1: Prevent and de-escalate potential crises with students

Competency 2: Safely and therapeutically manage crisis situations

Competency 3: Be able to process with students to help improve their coping skills

There are three levels of certification:

Level 1: Verbal de-escalation skills including the Life Space Interview (initial training of 21 hours)

- Level 2: Verbal de-escalation, LSI and TCIS protectives (initial training of 24 hours)
- Level 3: Verbal techniques, protectives and physical restraint techniques (initial training of 28 hours)

Furthermore, TCIS requires between 10 and 12 hours of refreshers annually, including on-going evaluation and formal assessments to maintain certification.

# Making meaning of challenging behaviors -How do I best respond?

## Language Acquisition Through Motor Planning (LAMP)

Language Acquisition through Motor Planning (LAMP) is a therapeutic approach based on neurological and motor learning principles. The goal is to give individuals who are nonverbal or have limited verbal abilities a method of independently and spontaneously expressing themselves in any setting.

LAMP was developed out of the clinical practices of John Halloran, MS, CCC-SLP, Cindy Halloran, OTR/L, and Mia Emerson, MS, CCC-SLP. In their interactions with nonverbal individuals with autism, they found that:

- Giving individuals access to core words on a speech-generating device
- Teaching those words in sensory-rich activities, and
- Accessing each word on the device with a consistent, unique motor pattern with auditory feedback provided a means for developing independent communication.

Language and social interaction may be affected by impairments in motor skills and auditory and sensory processing. Some interventions currently in use with individuals with autism focus on the perceived strengths associated with autism, such as visual learning and the desire for structure.

The LAMP approach not only utilizes visual learning and the desire for structure, but it also addresses core deficits affecting language delay to improve spontaneous, generative communication.

LAMP strives to improve language and communication by:

- Imitating the neurological processes associated with typical speech development
- Pairing a consistent motor movement with consistent auditory feedback and a natural response while using a speech generating device.

There are no cognitive prerequisites for the implementation of LAMP as intervention can begin at the cause and effect level and systematically build upon the stages of natural language development.

# Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools

Cornell University developed the Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) model for residential care as part of its Residential Child Care Project in the early 1980's. The foundations of this curriculum are in research based literature and programs. In 2007 Cornell responded to requests from various Board of Cooperative Education (BOCES) Centers and other public schools and adapted the TCI curriculum to meet the needs of schools. Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools (TCIS) gives WFL BOCES a framework for implementing a crisis prevention and management system that reduces the need to rely on high-risk interventions, complements the Response to Intervention (RTI) approach and includes aspects of trauma informed care.

There are three main competencies taught in the TCIS Training:

Competency 1: Prevent and de-escalate potential crises with students

Competency 2: Safely and therapeutically manage crisis situations

Competency 3: Be able to process with students to help improve their coping skills

There are three levels of certification:

Level 1: Verbal de-escalation skills including the Life Space Interview (initial training of 21 hours)

- Level 2: Verbal de-escalation, LSI and TCIS protectives (initial training of 24 hours)
- Level 3: Verbal techniques, protectives and physical restraint techniques (initial training of 28 hours)

Furthermore, TCIS requires between 10 and 12 hours of refreshers annually, including on-going evaluation and formal assessments to maintain certification.

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

# Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools

Cornell University developed the Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) model for residential care as part of its Residential Child Care Project in the early 1980's. The foundations of this curriculum are in research based literature and programs. In 2007 Cornell responded to requests from various Board of Cooperative Education (BOCES) Centers and other public schools and adapted the TCI curriculum to meet the needs of schools. Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools (TCIS) gives WFL BOCES a framework for implementing a crisis prevention and management system that reduces the need to rely on high-risk interventions, complements the Response to Intervention (RTI) approach and includes aspects of trauma informed care.

There are three main competencies taught in the TCIS Training:

Competency 1: Prevent and de-escalate potential crises with students

Competency 2: Safely and therapeutically manage crisis situations

Competency 3: Be able to process with students to help improve their coping skills

There are three levels of certification:

Level 1: Verbal de-escalation skills including the Life Space Interview (initial training of 21 hours)

- Level 2: Verbal de-escalation, LSI and TCIS protectives (initial training of 24 hours)
- Level 3: Verbal techniques, protectives and physical restraint techniques (initial training of 28 hours)

Furthermore, TCIS requires between 10 and 12 hours of refreshers annually, including on-going evaluation and formal assessments to maintain certification.




