Preview of 2017 SIP Plan

1. Increase the school avg. 7th grade SAGE writing sub-score by three points.
2. Increase the school avg. 9th grade SAGE writing sub-score by three points.
3. Increase the school avg. 9th grade SAGE writing sub-score by three points.
4. Reduce the number of students from the 2019-2020 cohort who fail a core subject by 2% when comparing their 8th grade data to their 9th grade data.
5. Use data collaborative teams to increase Evaluate Davis observation scores in the areas of “learners know what they are supposed to be learning and why” and “a variety of teacher checks for understanding are employed,” by 2% based on the previous year’s scores.
