Welcome:

March 29th at 8 am there is a meeting with Superintendent Newey to discuss the idea of becoming a technology based junior high. During the meeting they are also going to discuss getting rid of the computer labs and getting mobile laptops instead. \$155,000 have been requested in technology by the departments at SJH.

SIP Planning and Approval: The Proposed Plan

Music Department: SJH plan will not include productivity for Orchestra and Band courses. They will receive \$450 for Professional Development, \$500 for accompanist/assistant, \$800 for textbooks and \$420 for software purchases.

- Motion was made to put \$8,000 back into the Music Department- it was decided to come back and look at this proposal
- If our request to get productivity covered by the district is approved, it is suggested that we use the \$8,000 for replacing equipment

Tutoring: Have one math teacher there and potentially hire high school students or others later on.

Productivity Periods: request was cut from 3 productivities to 2.

Counseling: approved for \$14,000 1.75 Full Productivity period for remediation

Math: The proposal was cut because the cost is too high. Because we are waiting to see if the district is going to help us become a technology junior high, their proposal is being put aside. Funding it in parts has been viewed as not successful to the overall objective of the department.

- Motion was made to come back and look at this. It was proposed that CC approve planning/training salaries.
- If/when there is additional money, CC will look at possibly funding the trainings.

Foreign Languages: The proposal will be funded but it will be cut in half so that it is only being used by one teacher.

FACS Babies: There is money within the department to fund the babies and can be purchased immediately.

SPED: The proposal was cut because the cost is high and we need to fully fund it in order to be successful. We are waiting for the district to approve our school plans.

Counseling(Trackers focused on Non-attenders): The proposal was granted but was cut by \$10,000.

Professional Development: English and Ceramics have been granted their professional development classes.

English: Surface Pro Teaching Tool- the proposal was granted but was cut by \$552. There are cheaper options that they can use

Social Studies: The request was denied because there is AP money left over. Dr. Hadlock is going to talk to the teachers involved to make sure that the money will be used for all history departments.

Projector Refresh: The request has been split into 3 stages. It was then cut by \$21,000. A priority list will need to be made to ensure that teachers can use their new technology with the appropriate projectors (Math, English, Social Studies)

Art: The Press for the art class will be funded in full.

Vex IQ Robotics: request will be granted in full

Science: The proposal was cut from 30 units to 10 units (1 set). This next year will be a testing period for them and a request can be made for the following year once there is proof that it is working.

Motion was made to accept the School Improvement Plan and was passed.

MESA National Trip: It was proposed that some of money that was designated for school fundraising at the beginning of the year be used to cover the cost of their trip.
