A Time to Support your "Family"

Each year that June comes around on the school schedule, my thoughts drift to my own experience at independent school and the memories I have of this time. The first one is always exams probably because I wrote so many of them over my educational experience. I also vividly recall the memory of my younger brother who didn't have to write exams at the time playing in our backyard while I sat at my desk with my window open trying to stay focused and study effectively. The longing I had to go outside and join him is one memory that hasn't faded very much in my mind. The second memory I have of June is the ceremonies that occurred – commencement, awards days and athletics banquets. I think now, I realize the importance of these and the opportunities they present to celebrate accomplishments even when they weren't ones that I was awarded.

Specifically, I remember the year that my older brother was going to graduate high school. I had finished writing my necessary exams and didn't really feel it was necessary to come to this event. I was not graduating and I told my parents that I didn't expect my two brothers to come to my graduation, so it made sense for me not to attend. The truth be told, in the moment, it seemed a much better opportunity to do nothing at my house versus sitting in a hot gym wearing my school uniform watching a ceremony. The reaction from my parents was not one of agreement.... I remember them sitting me down and telling me that wasn't how our family worked and that it was extremely important to attend to support my brother. They acknowledged that it was going to be hot in the gym and that there might seem to be a better place to be; however, I was going to be at his graduation. At the time, I wasn't very happy with this decision and I attended grudgingly. My brother achieved an award that day (to my surprise) and I got to see and celebrate this and I was thankful that my parents made me come. I also got to acknowledge many of the students

that were friends of my brother that I appreciated and admired for various reasons. It was the right decision and I wouldn't have made without my parents wise (and unbending) council.

This Friday, June 19th at 7:00 p.m., each student in Grade 8-11 has a "big brother" or "big sister" in their Advisory family that is graduating from Southridge. It is important that they are there to help them celebrate and let them know that they are supporting them. Just like the students in their Advisory will be asked to attend their graduation in future years. I recently learned that a few Grade 11 students had tickets to a concert on this night and initially they were going to miss the Commencement. However, after thinking about it and wanting to support the Grads of 2015, they let me know that they were selling the tickets and attending the Southridge event. I was so pleased and proud of their decision and let them know!

Thank You to All! Advancement Year in Review

I would like to thank the Southridge Community for their generous support over the past year. Our three major events, two fundraising campaigns, and the many other events and initiatives within Advancement were all great successes!

The Great Gatsby Gala, chaired by Jody Thomas and Anita Hundal, was a great achievement. The 20's theme was embraced by all and was a fitting tribute to our 20th year. The support of our generous parent community allowed us to raise \$184,000 that evening and complete every project on our wish list, including new carpet throughout the Junior School. We are looking forward to another great gala next year – save the date – November 21, 2015!

The Country Fair was also a great success. The crowds came out on a beautiful day in May and were greeted by our warm and welcoming volunteers. Expenses are still being tallied, but we'll net more than \$50,000! What many of our families don't realize is that half of the money we raise from the Country Fair is earmarked for endowment funds that will one day support bursaries for students who would otherwise be unable to attend Southridge. The other 50% of the money we raise is used for capital items at the school. Thank you so much!

The golf tournament, our third major event of the year, was held only a few short weeks ago. We are still finalizing expenses, but we are able to report that more than \$15,000 was raised from our parent and alumni community. Thank you to all the golfers, sponsors, and dinner guests for your participation in this fun community event.

History was also made this year at Southridge School. In our 20th anniversary year, at our 20th Great Gatsby Gala, Mr. William Vandekherkhove, a current Southridge parent, made the single largest donation in our School's history – a gift of \$200,000. His generous donation will fund two major projects at the school, including a new school bus. The new bus is currently being built and we are hoping to have it in September.

Mr. Vandekherkhove's donation was also used towards our technology program. His gift allowed us to purchase tablets for all our teachers, who will use them next year in preparation for the student roll-out in 2016-2017. Thank you, Mr. Vandekherkhove!

Our Legacy Giving Campaign was also a great success. Once again, the vast majority of our new families made multi-year pledges totaling more than \$700,000. My personal thanks to all our canvassers and our very gracious new families who welcomed their visits. Thank you!

Through the EveryONE Annual Campaign, we raised over \$163,000. This allowed us to purchase all the items on our wish list, including the high jump mat for our Junior School track athletes, a set of tubular bells for our Senior School music program, as well as invest an additional \$91,000 in our endowment funds. Thank you to all our families who so generously gave to this campaign!

I would also like to extend our most sincere appreciation to Gemma Martini and Jackie Christofferson who spear-headed the 20th Anniversary Cookbook project. The funds raised through this project have allowed us to purchase a 3D printer. The printer will be set up over the summer and will be ready for our students' return and imaginations in September!

Reporting related to our fundraising events and campaigns would not be complete without acknowledgement and appreciation directed to our Southridge community volunteers. It is you who make our school the special community that it is. A special thank you to the volunteer committee, who work tirelessly behind the scenes to make sure that hundreds of volunteers are in place for the year!

ENGLISH 12 PROVINCIAL

• Friday, June 19th (12:00 p.m.)

This year the scheduled date for the English 12 examination in June is on June 19th which is the same afternoon as the Southridge Commencement ceremony. In consultation with the English **Curriculum Leader, Ms. Gail Robinson, and the English department we have decided to have ALL our students write on Thursday, May 14th Students who achieve a satisfactory grade will NOT need to write on the 19, but those who wish to strive for an improved grade will have the opportunity to write for a second time on Friday, June 19th starting at noon. Therefore, the commencement ceremony has been moved to 7:00 p.m.**

Southridge School Examinations: Friday, June 5th - Thursday, June 11th

The last day of classes for Southridge students will be **Thursday**, **June 4th**. Grade 8 final science tests will take place on Wednesday, June 3rd and for Grades 9 and 10 on Thursday, June 4th during classroom time. School examinations, which take place in the Senior School gymnasium, will begin the following day on Friday, June 5th and end on Thursday, June 11th. Full details of the schedule for each grade level will be published early in the third term.
