#### **Mv First Date**

When I first met my eventual spouse (Ms. McCaw) I was working at a boarding school in a small town in Quebec. I had known Ms. McCaw for a few months before asking her to join me for dinner one Saturday evening in late November twenty-four years ago.

I had heard from some of our students that Ms. McCaw's favourite meal was beef stroganoff. So, I thought I would prepare the special dish for her. It just so happened that there was a left-over package of freeze dried beef stroganoff in the outdoor education room, and I jumped at the chance to use it, feeling lucky for my apparent good fortune. My plan was to boil the water and mix-in the ingredients before Ms. McCaw arrived, discretely disposing the packaging in an effort to keep my preparation plan a secret.

Don't get me wrong. I really wanted the dinner to go well, and using the freeze dried food gave me some degree of assurance that it would. Certainly, beef stroganoff was a popular option with the students on back backing trips. It was also one of the more expensive meals prepared by the freeze dried food company. In addition, I thought I could embellish my lack of preparation with an appropriate table setting, soft lighting and complimentary background music.

Alas, it didn't take long for Ms. McCaw to realize what I had done, and she was not shy to give me some pointed feedback - including several major recommendations for improvement. I assured her that the next time (if there was going to be a next time) I would avoid freeze dried food of any variety. As luck would have it, another chance came my way a few months later. This time, I pulled out my trusty crock pot and attempted to demonstrate my response to Ms. McCaw's recommendations with a chicken and yam dish.

Even though I made some improvements, the chicken came out blanched white (I had neglected to add any spice or sauce while it was cooking) and the yams presented as bright orange. Although my cooking skills were disappointingly substandard, they had improved considerably from my freeze dried folly, and this time Ms. McCaw's feedback did not include any *major* recommendations.

For the past four days, Southridge has played host to a visiting team from the Canadian Accredited Independent School organization. Our nine visitors were on our campus to help us make our school even better, and their follow-up report will include recommendations for us to consider. Some of the report's recommendations may indeed be at the "beef stroganoff" major level while others will be more along the lines of "white chicken and yam" minor ones. Either way, Southridge will heed the suggested areas for attention in our continuous whole-school improvement plans as we look forward to the year 2021 when we will welcome back another CAIS accreditation team on our journey to be the best we can be.

#### Head of Senior School Life-Long Learning

The passage above comes from the Southridge mission statement. As you will know there are many components to this mission including having a positive attitude and seeking their passion; however, last Friday I was reminded about our commitment to instilling a desire for life-long learning in our students.

Initially you might be saying that last Friday there wasn't any school that day...which would be correct; however, we had a professional development day and it was during this productive day that I was inspired by our faculty.

There are a number of ways that we encourage and challenge our students to become life-long learners. Helping to instill a positive growth mindset is a key foundational piece of the puzzle as well as teaching students to demand a disciplined and consistent commitment to doing their very best each day. Many students, similar to me, are visual learners and it helps to "see" what life-long learning looks like in order to understand how they can match some of the key characteristics of an excellent example being set.

On Friday, I was reminded of the amazing modeling that our faculty provides to the students on a daily basis in this regard. During the day, we spent time sharing department goals as we develop or Senior School Educational Program (SSEP). The teachers listened intently to each presentation and provided thoughtful feedback to help clarify the goals. In addition, we participated in some discussion-based collaborative learning about articles on assessment and facilitation skills that created healthy tension and understanding amongst our group. There was such a high level of energy and commitment to growing as educators throughout the day.

I know that the students see this personal drive towards continual learning from their teachers daily whether it is a new technology being tried, a book being discussed, a documentary examined or just keeping up in the discipline that they teach. In addition, I am especially inspired when I witness a faculty member's excitement when their learning comes by way of the students being the teacher! Something that the student has shared or expressed is taken with such a respect and admiration from the teacher and they let them know that they have become richer with this knowledge.

I have been privileged to work at some very respectful independent schools across Canada and I can say with conviction that Southridge teachers, as a group, have such a commitment towards developing themselves both as educators and people. This progressive approach helps to motivate their peers, their students and their administrators to do the same. I feel very fortunate to be able to benefit from this energy and enthusiasm each day.

I know in speaking with many of you that you have noticed this same passion for life-long learning. I also know that many parents also make this same commitment as individuals in their own learning which helps to strengthen the modeling for our young people.
