#### Looking Forward to Seeing You at the Country Fair

The Country Fair is just a few weeks away and with over 900 volunteer shifts needed to be filled to run a successful event there is still time to <u>sign-up</u> if you have not already done so. As a matter of fact, with our return from March Break this week, it's an excellent time for people to fill volunteer shifts as we all plan our calendars and establish our commitments for the next few months. For those of you who may not be aware, the money raised at this year's Fair will support three important purchases for our school. To help manage and mitigate that risk, we need a strong Southridge presence on sight all day long. 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So, please come on out to the Country Fair and join in the warm and friendly atmosphere of our school's sense of community by volunteering and contributing your time to the festivities on May 6<sup>th</sup>. You'll be glad you did – and so will your children. See you there!

# Junior School Reunification Drill – Important Information for ALL Junior School Families

**On Thursday, April 13th the Junior School will be conducting a Reunification Drill**. A Reunification Drill is a simulation of the procedures the School would undertake to reunite students with families/care-givers in the event of an emergency situation that warrants evacuating and/or closing our school. Schools are required to run reunification drills by the Ministry of Education, in order to ensure appropriate plans are in place in the event of emergencies.

Our reunification drill will require that **Junior School** students be picked up early from the School by a parent or designated adult on the afternoon of April 13th. If you are unable to participate in the drill, your child will be taken back to their classroom at 2:30 p.m., and regular dismissal will follow at 3 p.m.

### Please familiarize yourself with the details below, so that your family can help us to execute this drill in an efficient manner:

- Our drill will begin at 12:30 pm with a mock earthquake, followed by a full evacuation of the Junior School.
- The drill will involve all students from K-7 ONLY. Regular classes are in session for students in Grades 8-12.
- Once attendance procedures have been completed, parents will receive an email and/or text message from the school instructing you to come pick up your child. At that time, the person picking up the child should make their way to the campus.
- Please wait until you hear from the School before driving or walking to pick up your child(ren). Please do not arrive early; you should make your way from wherever you would normally be.
- <u>One adult (or designate)/family will need to come to the campus to collect the child(ren) once the drill is enacted and a text or email is received.</u>
- Please do not text message or phone your child during the drill.



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- The campus will be closed to all vehicular traffic there will be only pedestrian access to the campus during the drill. Parents or caregivers picking up students will need to park off-campus and walk in. Please plan ahead for this.
- Please ensure that you do not park in any designated no parking zones on 160<sup>th</sup> Street or other neighboring side streets. You can also park in the lot at the Home Depot. Only use designated cross-walk areas when crossing the street.
- If you are within walking distance of the school, please consider leaving your vehicle at home and walking to the school to get your child(ren).
- Each child in a family will be provided with a password that MUST be given by the parent or designated caregiver when they arrive at the school in order to take a child off the campus. If someone other than a parent is picking a child up (e.g. grandparent, care giver, etc.), they too will need to know the password for each child. Only share your child's password with the person picking up your child.
- Passwords will be sent home on a sticker placed on the inside cover of each child's prep book on Friday, April 7.
- Please memorize and/or write down the password, or take a photo and store it in your device for each of your children, so that you have it ready when you arrive to pick up your child(ren). Passwords will consist of the name of the student's house and their ID number (e.g. Orcas 3333).
- In order to collect your child(ren) you will go through a "double gate" release process. The first gate is the REQUEST GATE (located at West side of the Turf Field by the cross walk). Here, you will be asked to fill in a *Student Request Form*. You will need to provide the name your child, their grade, their teacher's name and their password. Once this is done, a runner will collect your child and bring them to the second gate, called the REUNIFICATION GATE (located at the north entry to the turf field by the cross walk), where you will meet them and sign-off for their release.
- Student's cannot be taken from the campus without password verification and without an adult's signature.
- After signing out at the Reunification Gate, parents and students are to leave the campus immediately. Please follow signs and procedures as instructed by Junior School Faculty and Staff.
- Students will be outdoors for up to 2 hours during the drill. It will be a casual day in the Junior School. Students should dress for the weather! Please check the weather forecast and plan accordingly. Students will have all of their belongings with them when they evacuate the school.



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- All students, K-7 will eat their lunch in their classrooms. There will be no café service please ensure your child comes to school with a bag lunch.
- Please talk with your child in advance about who will pick them up.
- We hope to have maximum participation in the drill; however if you are unable to participate, your child will be taken back to their classroom at 2:30 p.m., and regular dismissal will follow at 3 p.m.

This is the first time Southridge will run a drill of this type! Please help us by being patient and calm, and by planning ahead. The drill will take time and at times, it will likely feel chaotic. Please respect the importance of the drill and the learning that will take place that will inform our Emergency Preparedness Plan and Procedures.

### **Important Parking Lot Reminders**

Please be mindful and respectful of our parking lot safety guidelines – keeping students safe is our top priority.

- Do not park vehicles in front of the Kindergarten and Grade 1 classrooms. This is not a vehicle pick-up area.
- Please do not ask your child to wait for you at the Junior School entry gate and then have them step out into the flow of traffic to enter your vehicle. Students should only cross at the designated cross-walks and should enter vehicles in a safe manner.
- Please do not stop/park just inside the Junior School entry gate as this impedes the flow of traffic and other families' abilities to join in the vehicle loop as they enter the campus. We need to leave the first 30-40 ft. clear. Please respect the cones, even if they are on the grass.
- If you are waiting for your child in the pick-up lane along the fence, please DO NOT leave your vehicle. Often times, we need to ask vehicles to move forward to create space for other drivers to pull in and when you leave your vehicle we



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cannot do this. If you wish to leave your vehicle, you will need to use a designated parking space.

- Please use the designated cross-walks when crossing the road. Your children are watching the example you set when you cross the driveway in front of moving vehicles you are modelling unsafe behaviours. We are seeing an increase in students crossing the driveways at undesignated locations which is very dangerous for both pedestrians and drivers.
- Instead of letting your frustration levels elevate, why not consider a perspective shift and use the time to catch your breath by taking a mindful moment while you wait.
- Please speak respectfully to Junior School Faculty and Staff who are in the parking lot working to keep your children safe. Modeling patience, respectful communication and care in front of our children will help set a more positive tone and example.

Thank you for your cooperation and immediate adherence to these safety requests.

#### Regulation Summer Dress Begins Tuesday, April 18th!

Regulation Summer Dress is in effect starting on Tuesday, April 18<sup>th</sup>. Please be advised that this is slightly earlier than the May 1<sup>st</sup> date in previous years. Summer Dress will be in effect through to Friday, October 6<sup>th</sup> (slightly later than the October 1<sup>st</sup> date in previous years). Students are permitted to wear the following uniform items:

- Green vest, cardigan or pullover sweater
- Southridge crested white golf shirt or white button down dress shirt/blouse
- Black walking shorts or black skort with white ankle socks
- Grey dresspants with grey socks (and optional black belt)
- Primary only tunic with white ankle socks
- MYP only kilt worn with white or black knee socks
- Black polishable leather shoes with a black sole (Please note: students may wear a runner style black leather shoe as long as it is polishable and does not have any obvious logos on the shoe. For example, black leather Keds or Vans are acceptable.)



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Please ensure all your child's uniform items are clearly labelled. Students who are unable or unwilling to maintain a tidy summer appearance will be required to wear the Winter Uniform.
