I am very thankful to the music teachers at Southridge – Mrs. Winterburn, Dr. Bespflug, Mr. Burrage, Ms. Parker and Mr. Mitchell. Along with our other teachers in the Junior and Senior Schools, they facilitate a wonderfully student-centred and collaborative learning environment where our students are challenged to learn important skills and to develop as people. As we transition into the winter break and we look forward to enjoying time with family and friends, I hope you make the time to appreciate the beauty of the season through music.

The Red Kite: A Metaphor

During the summer of 2015, my family and I took a road trip along the Oregon and Washington coast. It was a magical experience for all of us as we explored different beaches and forests, and just took in the sheer beauty of it all. Truly a trip worth taking. Before we stopped to visit Cannon Beach, my husband Ian insisted that we stop to purchase a kite - not just any kite, but a red kite. He had a mental image of himself and the kids flying a red kite on Cannon Beach and he wanted to make it a reality. So purchase a red kite we did. While it wasn't the windiest of days or the fanciest of kites, that little red kite took flight just as the sun was setting across the beach. It was a moment that took my breath away as I stood back, camera in hand and watched my husband and kids set the kite soaring while their bodies danced across the beach, racing to keep up with it. It's a magical image, and one that I revisit in mind's eye often.

My memory of flying that red kite has also become a metaphor for learning for me. The process of learning is much like flying a kite. There are certain conditions that need to be in place for the kite to get up in the air - there needs to be wind, there needs to be open space, there needs to be some understanding of a how a kite works. When the kite finally launches, the challenge then becomes keeping it up in the air. However, ultimately, the kite will come down from its heights and its cord will likely need some untangling, before the launch process is reset. Learning is much like this - the conditions need to be right for each learner to fly his/her "learning kite". When learning takes flight, much like when a kite does the same, there is joy, a little bit of magic, and a feeling of limitlessness (otherwise known as flow). However, just as the kite must come down from its heights, inevitably, so must learning. This is the ebb and flow of the learning process - the challenge of getting the "learning kite" in the air, the success that comes as the kite soars, followed by the challenge (and sometimes let down) of the kite descending from its heights. But, what always remains is the invitation to try to fly it again. Untangling that metaphorical "learning kite" cord when the kite comes down is where the important lessons are learned, new skills are solidified, and the grit and resilience to try to soar again is born.

On Friday, your child will bring home his/her Term One Progress Report. As you take in the feedback about your child's learning so far this school year, think of that red kite and the metaphor. Each child has different needs as we seek to create the conditions for his/her "learning kite" to soar. It's our role as educators and parents, working together, to encourage and support each learner to build the resilience and determination to continue



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to want to fly their "learning kite" again and again. Celebrate both the successes and the challenges that have arisen over this first term of learning, and remember that flying the "learning kite" is a continuous process rather than a finite destination.
