#### **Head of Junior School**

#### **Learning Under Construction...**

This week as I walked through classrooms I noticed how much hands on learning is taking place - students were *literally* constructing meaning to make sense of their inquiries and new understandings.

In Grade 1, communities literally sprung up out of the floor as students applied their understanding of what a community needs as they planned, constructed and engineered the places and spaces their communities would need. In Grade 3 students were in the planning phases of a helpful invention, using the design cycle to ensure that their invention was both innovative and purposeful. In Grade 4, students were using recycled materials to build prototypes as they applied their understanding of renewable energy, and in their art classes students were also playing with found materials as they engaged in preliminary sculpture work. In Grade 6, students explored materials and fibres by examining them through digital microscopes.

These are just some snapshots of what learning looked like over the last week. As I observed students engaging in their learning it was highly evident that they were enjoying themselves as they were challenged to construct meaning in new and novel ways. In each example I've described, a common element is the notion that learning can and should be playful. When meaning is constructed through hands on, playful learning we invite and provoke students to be curious with their ideas and thinking, and we empower them to be able to communicate about the process of learning.

In each classroom that I visited, the students couldn't help but want to show me <u>and</u> tell me about their ideas, decisions, processes, challenges and successes. A learning environment that invites playfulness and inquiry provides the fertile ground for problem solving, innovation, and creativity to grow, while also placing students at the center of constructing their own meaning as they build the skills needed to make sense of their world.

#### **Late Arrival to School**

As a school administrator, one of my primary mandates is to ensure that your son or daughter has a safe experience while at school. One way we to do that is to take attendance in an advisory block between 8:00 am and 8:08 am each day. If students miss advisory, or arrive late, they will likely be marked absent. Every day, Kristy MacKinnon, our Senior School receptionist, spends a good part of her morning looking for students who are unaccounted for. An email goes out that says something like, "looking for the following students..." Teachers are busy teaching their classes and often do not see Kristy's email, so Kristy has to get up from her desk and physically go looking for students who have been marked absent, but for whom we have not received any indication from home that the student would be away. This is a daily occurrence for Ms. MacKinnon that keeps her from doing the myriad other things she has to do in a day.

How can you help? When your son or daughter is going to be away, please phone the school or email attendance@southridge.bc.ca with details on the absence.

Many students arrive late to school and there are many reasons for this, including: they slept in, traffic was bad, it took 10 minutes to get from the front gates of the school to the Senior School drop-off area (consider having them get out of the car closer to the gates and walk!), and many other excuses. In fact, Monday morning this week, 44 students arrived late to school! This is simply way too many. When students arrive to class late it disrupts the activities happening in class and negatively impacts learning. Please consider leaving home a few minutes earlier, but when arriving late to school is unavoidable, and students arrive after 8:05, please ensure that your son or daughter signs in at the front desk. This will help Ms. MacKinnon immensely and allow her to get to the other very important tasks that she is responsible for throughout the day.

Thank you to all the parents who make a point of informing the school of absences, and who strive to get their kids here on time!

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## Student Marks and reporting them to Post Secondary Institutions.

Grade 12 can be an anxious time for both students and their parents. Ms. Livingston, Ms. Becker and I have been talking to our grade 12 students to advise them of the best procedure for ensuring that their marks are reported in an accurate and timely manner.

The criteria and deadlines for applying to different institutions and programs have become much more varied and complex, as institutions vie for the very best students, and we need to help our students advocate for themselves in an appropriate manner. To this end I have clarified what is, and is not, appropriate in discussing marks with their teachers. Students should not approach teachers directly for additional marks, or ask for extra assignments to generate better marks. They can, and should, ask for help in developing their skills and understanding, attend additional tutorials, work with a peer tutor – all of which may lead to the desired improvement in performance.

I have advised students that if they need to advocate for an increased mark – they are just shy of an average for a competitive program or a major scholarship for example - then the correct pathway would be to go directly to Ms. Becker or Ms. Livingston. Similarly, we would ask that parents follow the same procedure and approach the University Counsellors with any specific requests. Together Ms. Becker, Ms. Livingston and I would discuss the legitimacy of the request and approach the teachers concerned. Please be assured that, though we must maintain our integrity as an academic institution, we will always work for the optimum benefit of our students.

#### The Making of Southridge School's New Video

I love storytelling. Sharing the Southridge story with the world is truly the *best* part of my job, and I'm always striving to find compelling ways to tell it. There's no question that video is a powerful tool, so I was excited when, earlier this Fall, with the help of some colleagues and collaborators, I had the opportunity to develop a fresh, new promotional video for our school.

Working with local production company, <u>Capitol Media House</u>, we set out to create a light-hearted and inspiring video that authentically captured the Southridge experience and shared who we are as a community. The approach we took was to showcase our students – their talents, their passions, their hopes and their dreams. Our goal was to tell the story of Southridge through their eyes – to see and hear about what they're learning, why they feel inspired by their teachers and peers, what they hope to accomplish in their lives, and how they hope to make a difference.

To achieve this, we decided to take a somewhat "risky" approach. Rather than writing a script and providing our students with details about what we wanted them to say, which would have ensured a predictable outcome, we decided we preferred raw, truthful, candid responses. We would work with whatever we got! So, we developed a list of questions, which were not provided to students in advance of filming. The responses you see from our students in the video are honest, in-the-moment, and from the heart.



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Additionally, we gave our faculty very little notice for filming and did not set out a plan for which activities would be recorded across the school or in the classrooms. The broad diversity of footage you see is what we captured over a two-day period – this is just "two days at Southridge" – and it's pretty awesome! Amazing things happen here everyday.

I am incredibly grateful to everyone who supported this project – teachers who opened their classrooms, students who took time out of their busy schedules to be interviewed, families who allowed their kids to be featured in this way, and our incredible our film crew who truly captured that "special something" about Southridge – you really helped bring our vision to life!
