1. Troy gave a brief overview of his Firm's experience building MSBA High Schools. Troy also introduced James Aspirino from PARE Corp. PARE is the project's Civil Engineer.

III. MSBA Grant Opportunity and MSBA Process

- 3. Lynn Stapleton took the crowd through some slides from the Power Point presentation in regards to the MSBA Grant Opportunity and the MSBA Process. Lynn explained that the City had been given an opportunity to receive a grant reimbursement from the MSBA to pay costs associated with a new school facility project. This grant opportunity was offered in part because of the condition of the existing building infrastructure and the lack of building and energy code compliance of the present facility.
- 4. Lynn went on to explain that the MSBA funding comes from one cent of the Massachusetts 6.25% sales tax. This is tax paid by Fall River residents and taxpayers throughout the commonwealth. Lynn then showed a slide that included the many surrounding Cities and Towns that have received this same support.
- 5. Lynn then explained the requirements that need to be followed to receive a grant from the MSBA. The first step is to complete a comprehensive feasibility study in collaboration with the MSBA to determine the most financially and educationally responsible long-term solution. The Feasibility Study is what the Project Team has been working for the last 6 months. There are over fifty construction professionals working over a collective of 4,600 hours on the project to this point. Lastly, Lynn reviewed the current MSBA Building Process Schedule with the group. Lynn explained that the current Feasibility Study Phase would conclude in late June and would be followed by the Schematic Phase. The Schematic phase would last till January 2018 and be followed by the Project Scope and Budget and Project Funding Agreement Phase and then move on to the Design Development, Construction Documents and Bidding Phase. Construction would be complete by June 2022.

IV. Site Selection Process

6. James Aspirino from PARE Corporation took the crowd through some slides in regards to the recent site selection process. There were four sites considered during this process. These sites include the existing High School Site, Duro Mills Site, Fall River Industrial Park Site and Anawan Mills Site. All sites were



evaluated based on the following criteria- Cost of property, location of property and adjacencies, buildable area and restrictions, and potential environmental issues.

7. The pros and cons for each site were evaluated and the clear winner was the existing high school site. The existing High School site is owned by the City has sufficient land for an addition or new school and has no known environmental issues.

V. Evaluation of Existing Conditions

8. Troy Randal from Ai3 took the crowd through some slides relative to the existing conditions of the building. The slides showed many building envelope issues including active leaks in the roof and failure of windows. Some other slides highlighted the lack of ADA compliance in the building. Most of the bathrooms are out of compliant and there is no ADA elevator between floors. Some other slides showed areas of sever cracking in the building façade including cracking of existing ACM exterior panels.

VI. Educational Visioning Sessions

- 9. Troy then took the crowd through some slides relative to the Visioning Sessions. Over the last two months, there have been four, half day Visioning Sessions. These Visioning Sessions are comprised of Faculty, Staff and Students. Participation was excellent and often had as many as 55 participants in attendance.
- 10. At these sessions, design priorities were reviewed and discussed. Some examples of these design opportunities include; branding and identity, Connections and outdoor spaces, distributed dining, collaborative spaces and visible learning. Additionally, guiding principles for design were discussed some of the major wants from the group were- "Small school feel, large school pride", "A place you want to be", and to have outdoor connections.

VII. Public Comments

3. Gerald Fallon (1006 Maple Street)

In my opinion this building should have a slanted roof, windows that open and corridors you can look down.

I am a Parent of five children that attended Durfee High School. I appreciate the Arts Programs and think they should be preserved and expanded.

4. Dave Dennis (132 Highland Avenue)

This new High School is a long time coming. Please consider in your design the great diversity that is present in the Fall River Community.

We are not wealthy people but we have great pride. We will be watching this process closely. We will not accept sub standard construction. We expect to have a world-class facility.

5. Sean Connell (219 Purchase Street)

How much are the estimates for the cost of the project and how much will the State contribute?

There is not a design yet for the project. There are many options that still need to be vetted before there is a design that can be responsibly budgeted. We will have more information at future public forums.



Fall River- Durfee High School Project - Public Forum No. 1

The District of Fall River qualifies for an 80% State Contribution from the MSBA. However, this 80% contribution does not include many costs that the MSBA deem ineligible. These ineligible costs can bring down the 80% contribution significantly. We will have a better understanding about this percentage contribution in the future as the design develops.

6. Audrey M. Poitras (68 Racher Street)

I am a retired teacher who taught in Fall River for 13 years. I would like to see the new Durfee have a bell tower like the old Durfee High School on Rock Street.

Though we have not started the design, we are considering adding some of the dominant features from the old Rock Street, Durfee High including the bell tower into the new design.

7. Joe Naughton (578 Long Street)

The new High School should be built to include the future of CVTE. CVTE students do go on to College.

The High School should be built with extra space for future growth. Keep in mind 20 years ahead. Education is the corner stone of economic development. The field house should stay and the theater should stay.

8. Kristen Gavin (593 Madison Street)

I went to Durfee High School and I now have three children that will go to the new Durfee High School. What are your plans for logistics while the new school is being built.

It is too early to talk specifics about construction logistics as a design and approach has not been yet determined. We can say that we will strive to make the building as least disruptive to education as possible.

VIII. Closing

9. Lynn Stapleton thanked everyone for their participation. Lynn also encouraged people to leave additional comments if any on the Durfee Rising Facebook and Twitter Pages.

Of these options, Option 1E was selected as the as the preferred solution for further development during the schematic design phase.
- 8. Some of the advantages of Option 1E were reviewed. Some of the advantages include a simplified building layout improving for way finding, security, etc., the maintaining of the athletic facility, and most of the athletic fields, and minimal disruption for students during construction.
- 9. The presentation included some 3D massing renderings of Option 1E.

4. Matt Sunderson (No Address Given)

It looks like parking spaces are being lost. How do you address that?

Actually there is a net add of parking spaces in Option 1E. It just appears that there is less because the parking is more distributed.

Will the vocational programs be maintained?

Yes, the school has six programs currently and we are applying for two more.

5. Joyce Rodrigues (188 Cottage Street)

Please clarify where the performing arts spaces are located.

Troy from Ai3 pointed on the 3D Massing rendering with a laser pointer to North-West corner of the building and explained that the theater and other Art related programs would be located in this general area. Troy also explained that the current option 1E plans to leave the existing theater building for the town to re-purpose as a community theater and education admin area. It was also said that this community theater/education admin area would be a separate project from the new Durfee High School.


